Scalp Hemorrhage.

E. Laplace, Philadelphia (*Journal A. M. A.*), advises a close rubber bandage over the scalp with four turns of a quarter-inch rubber tubing around the head at the level of the external auditory meatus for hemorrhage from scalp wounds. The tubing is secured in place by tying the bandage over it after it has been applied and the bandages tightened by pulling the rubber bandage down over the occipital protuberance where the pressure prevents hemorrhage in operations on the cerebellum. It is, he claims, convenient and always available.
