Saturday October 15th

I felt quite a bit better today but not quite up to
the mark yet. We didn't get the sheep all up this fore-
noon and picked out of what we considered the
best ewes and put them over in the other field with
old Archie. We also picked out the best ewe lambs
and marked them. The others we will sell if we

can, but the sheep market is very poor, in fact so is
any live stock market, and buyers are scarce. This
after noon Dad and I went out and set up four more
rows of corn shocks. I didn't work very hard at it.
The band went to Honey Brook Fair this afternoon but
I sent them word that I couldn't go. I went down
to-night to a meeting of the Girls boys but there
were only three out, it being the first of the season. Walter
