Sun 23.

Mr. Shaw in the pulpit, he preached a lovely sermon. Mr. Tallaker Pastor of the Church is in Ottawa. Attended Service at Hurly to night, and sang as usual.

Mon 24

July 24th 1893.

Most beautiful day, cool in the morning, but very pleasant all day. The funeral of the infant child of Kenneth Harding, son of A. Harding took place today, he died on Saturday at five o'clock P.M.

Lovely but very hot. Drove to the City with Mr. W. H. Seed and attended a garden party held in Mr. Edwin Lawton. Had an enjoyable time after making the acquaintance of many friends.
