Gynecological Hints.

It is seldom good practice to remove abdominal tumors by the vaginal route; on the other hand, where the vagina is large and the perineum relaxed, pelvic tumors can frequently be attacked from below. This is especially true when the uterus and growth are freely movable. Usually the anterior vaginal incision gives the most room. Tumors of the tubes and ovaries can easily be extirpated without removing the uterus. When possible, this route should be selected, for the mortality is lower and convalescence is much easier. Unless pus is found, it is seldom necessary to drain after opening the abdomen through the vagina.—Waldo; *Int. Journ. Surg.*
