1. Fine day. Pa & Far went to Cornwall. took a grist of 24 bush, 3 bush wheat. Pa got Ross a fur cap \$2.00. and got the Statutes for 1887.
2. Thursday Women's meeting at John M Lerman's R.R. 18 present. The old officers reappointed. Got 1/2 gal. coal oil at D's charged has been a very fine day.
3. Lovely day. sent letter to Murdy \$12.00, M Killop \$6.00, vote James.
4. Got the due bill from Dan. and paid for the things we got.
5. Rev. G. given, preached. Morning he read 13. chapt 1st Corint and Psalm 137 to the 32 vers. text 1st John 4. chapt. 16 vers. God is love.
6. This has been a fine day. 11. P.M. I was at the Temperance meeting. There was a very good attendance. Donald the Widow. D.D. has a raffle tonight at Sullivan's.
7. Has dull and snowed a little all day. Mrs. Walker \$5.50 for last month. Far took 2 or 3 bags to the mill. Pa was not in the bush today.
8. Far and I were out at the George Ferguson's girls house and had a very pleasant time. we did not get home until 9 P.M.
10. Last night night was the coldest that was felt here for years 42. below zero. This morning Far & I went to Montrois mills with 22 bush of oats. and then we went to the lot of Kenyon to see Allen M Lerman's folk.
11. Not so cold today. got 1/2 lb raisins. 1 qt syrup.
12. Mr. Given preached in the Hall.
13. Nice warm day. Pa & Far in bush.
20. One week since I wrote. it was raining all this day. we had a Mr M Lerman to preach yesterday. a McGill student. Last week I sent Murdy \$8.00. My Mother paid Pa. 25.00. The Fergussons sawed all our wood. Hannah is here.
21. Rainy nice and warm. Collecting for Bible Society 55.
22. There is an account of a cyclone having destroyed a number of houses in Mount Vernon Illinois on Monday evening. Prayer meeting J. Dignall R.R. led the meeting. sent Murdy 13.00.
