June 1 very warm day the horses was let out last night for the first time I took the milk this morning & made a hen coop for the young turkeys planted ^{peas} ~~peas~~ ^{seed at the barn}

- 2 I cleaned out the potatoes out of the cellar in the forenoon I met Mr. Michaelson at the station Mr. Gliter preached this morning Mr. Nielsen at night
- 4 we sowed the Millet on the 3 ridges next the ditch below the old house put the wheel cultivator on it sowed more on the head ridge & ^{East} side of the field north of the barn that is in the Southeast corner
- 5 picked stones of the field Northeast of the barn with the waggon drew them to the fence where the three ways in the road was Slap the water running into the field in the spring the ground very dry
- 6 I rolled with the New roller - it worked well he rolled the field north east of the barn the grub is cutting off the wheat there
- 7 I rolled what I left of the middle field and the old house field the ground is very dry
- 8 I went through the potatoes in the garden with the cultivator & picked bugs of them
- 9 had some of the potatoes in the garden Mr. W.S. Smith come to night with a buggy for to preach tomorrow he come from near Kingster a fine rain Mr. Smith preached this morning & Mr. Olives at night
- 11 I had some in the garden to day I worked
- 12 on the roads in the village warm day
- 13 I worked in the roads for I with the horse
- 14 we began to work on the roads & drove gravel out of the foundation of the New English Church I had the team Wallace and me worked with the shovel
- 15 finished our work to day very hot day
- 16 a fine rain last night & this morning I met Mr. Michaelson at the station I drew 3 loads of sand & 1 of stones for F. Deon Rev. Mr. Trumble preached this morning & Mr. Nielsen at night
