 29 J. Joe & Flavins helped B. C. cut wheat. W. fine
 I brought home grain this evening
 30 Both plowed A.M. I waited on my Mother P.M. she is
 worse again. we have to handle her like a child. B. C.
 B. N. B. D. & a great many more of our sect went to
 Toronto today to see a large number of Russian
 Menmonites that are emigrating to Manitoba
 about 330 passed through Toronto last week
 My Brothers went to see them too
 31 waited on my Mother A.M. went for Dr
 Machell P.M. W. fine rain last night
 August 1 waited on my Mother nearly all day & little
 John drew in small load wheat A.M. B. D. B. C.
 & wife were here P.M. my Mother keeps poorly
 Sunday 2 at home J. D. B. D. & B. C. were here
 my Mother is better (B. D. went with a large party
 of Menmonites as far as Service he thinks they are
 very nice people) W. fine cool. pretty windy
 3 drew in full wheat. 10 loads. good crop. W. fine clear
 4 I raked wheat stubble A.M. Joe plowed. both plowed
 P.M. drew in rakings after supper 12 loads. W. clear
 5 Both plowed. W. fine clear
 6 finished plowing fallow A.M. I & Nancy went to
 Lehman's P.M. Joe scuffled turnips W. fine
 7 Joe scuffled last of turnips A.M. I & little boys
 hoed second time. all hoed P.M. W. warm little
 8 finished hoeing turnips till 2 P.M. then ^{shower} pulled ^{some} potato
 out of hill Corn till supper then brought a load of
 sawdust & little boys took a swim. W. pretty warm
 Sunday 9 at home A.M. went to J. D. B. M. my Mother
 went with us. girls went to B. N. W. very warm
 10 pulled headlands in big Peafield & cut & bound oats
 in little Orchard & road partly round oat field

below garden ^{any} A.M. ¹⁸⁷⁷ started to pull Peas with
 rake P.M. when a fine shower stopped us then
 Flavins went home & I & Joe cleaned up ^{bag} floor
 I went to Cedar Grove & he cut road in big oat field
 11 Joe borrowed in fallow & I took my mother to B. D. & M.
 pulled Peas with rake P.M. worked well. W. warm clear
 12 finished Peas back of garden till about 4 P.M.
 Then Joe & Flavins bound swath round big oat field
 I & Nancy went to Belpool after supper W. about
 the most sultry & warm day I remember in a good
 13 I & Flavins helped B. C. pull Peas with ^{whill} ^{Cooley} ^{trough} ^{at}
 I didn't do much. drank rather much yesterday
 killed a lamb & brought home chop from B. D.
 14 B. C. & his 2 men helped us cut ^{W. fine} ^{cool} spring wheat in
 field behind old barn about 5 acres got done
 about 2 past 2 o'clock. then cut about 3 acres in big
 oat field got all shocked up. W. fine clear
 B. D. & Joe drew in Peas. Flavins helped C. B. thresh. Came
 home between 2 & 3 helped us get in 10 loads. W. warm
 Sunday 16 went to meeting at Hebron My Mother
 went too Remarks by B. C. sermon by
 by Rev. H. Barker, Furlow & J. H. Ramey were
 here after service. W. fine warm clear
 17 I started early to Dr. Machell to get pills for
 my Mother she had a very bad night B. C. & his
 men came to help at oats got big field done
 about 2 past 5 o'clock did not get them all bound
 W. pretty warm. looks like rain this evening
 18 finished binding oats new Harrow then cut field
 below garden did not get them all bound. W. fine clear
 very smoky. there are large fires in the north
 19 helped B. C. cut spring wheat till 3 P.M. then shocked
 oats till night did not get done. W. warm clear
 20 finished binding little field & shocking it & big
 field then cut very near all oats north of B. C.
 W. a slight shower A.M. very close P.M.
 21 finished cutting & shocking oats north of B. C.
 & cut spring wheat north of graveyard. A.M. W. fine shower P.M.
