 My bonnet did not come. Jimmie had Mulliner
 working with his team 25^{cts} pr hour, Jimmie
 was disking with George & Miss Jew.
 21 Fine day cold wind. Did not sow a seed, except
 a few pansy & sweet peas. Bonnet came by car
 Murdy did not call at the Station. To Jimmie 10.00
 22 A fine day, but cold. Rev D. H. McLennan preached
 in St Andrews, today
 23 Heavy frost last night. nice day. Dout got 4 bush
 outs. 22 lb clover seed
 24 Fine day Aunt Hall 7 hours 35^{cts} To sugar 25^{cts} 60
 2 lb raisins 25 yeast 5. paid Marion 1st for 1.30
 ballance on Estons goods. Teletime 13^{cts} 13
 Sowed onions planted 3 potatoes Naught 6
 and a few other potatoes. and some beans
 25 Bridie and family came yesterday.
 I began to make my black dress yesterday
 day. I sowed carrots & beets today. It be-
 gan to rain about 8. A M. To salt 10
 butter 36 March 10
