- 13 Fine day Jimmie & Hatty went in the morning to Lancaster, and went to Donald Taylors and did not get back until 10 P. M. There was a collection taken up in our church for fuel & insurance, we gave nothing
- 14 Drove Hatty to the Branch, and went to see Peggy she is pretty well
- 15 A snowstorm today we will likely have winter now. The oldest inhabitant does not remember so fine a fall, Walter Shack paid \$4<sup>00</sup> he has paid for 11 months
- 16 Fine cool day. There was a little snow in the morning, I washed, sent the paper to Far, a man with a magic lantern in St. A's Hall. Beautiful moonlight 10.30 P. M. not enough snow for ploughing Council met on Tuesday, Pa got credit for the wire he put on some ground lot
