

Wednesday, March 11

1917

- May 6<sup>th</sup> Earl went to Hamilton on Sat. for over Sunday.
- .. Will Millers came over in afternoon and stayed for tea.
- 8<sup>th</sup> Finished sowing 303 Pts in 14 acre field of Clump.
- 9<sup>th</sup> Saded Clump field with Clover & Timothy.
- 10 & 11<sup>th</sup> Cultivated & harrowed corn ground.
- 12 .. Sold 5 fat cattle to Jim Wallace, shipped at Glenmore.
- 13 - Mr & Mrs Moore and Lillian and Mrs Moore came over and we all went down Church, it being "Hot Church" Sun.
- 14 - Started to draw manure to corn ground with spreader. Drove to Galt in the afternoon, going to Council Meeting at the Glen to get Peth. Masters instructions. Came home from Galt by Mr. C. Scott and stopped at Duncan Mill for tea.
- 15<sup>th</sup> Stretched wire fence at north of driving-shed. Drove to Bramford by Paris, took 2 bales of hay to Gordon and some pot shoes & apples to May one, also drove down to Williams for a little while.
- 17<sup>th</sup> Plowed the garden and planted early potatoes a few hills of Empire State, 4 rows of Irish Cobbler. 52 of 10. Mr & Mrs Lee and Miss Rutherford came over for dinner and brought a yearling heifer to fruit but to pasture.
- 18<sup>th</sup> Plowed & rolled mangel ground.
- 19 - Took 13 young cattle to the bush and repaired the fence. Cemented around stone chimneys etc. Dolly & Bob came over for the night. A very heavy thunder-storm
