- 2 I am doing a few things, so that there will not be so many tomorrow
- 3 Ann Hall ^{old} day 80^{cts}. To her feed 1.65 Bacon 85 3.50
- 4 70 2 lbs butter 80. 1 lb tea 40 1 gall Coal oil 20 1.30
- 5 3 loaves 18. May baked 3 cakes. 70 sugar 30 68
- 6 1 loaf 6 Katie Christie came and dusted the parlor. Heard that Ruben Burton died 6
- 7 May came at 1. P. M. made sandwiches There were 12 at the meeting, I gave 50^{cts} to the W. M. S. and 50 to the H. M. S. and 5 for tea 1-5 The day was very fine
- 8 Dull I am not well my right ankle is very much pained, whether from cold or fatigue I know not
- 9 70 butter 70 steak at Mc Intyres charged 70 4 loaves 24. We are expecting Rubens Burton remains tomorrow 24
- 10 Heard that Rubens remains did not get to Maxville yet. He died in Los Angeles My Sunday off 25 25
- 11 I am preparing dinner for a few people that will be at the funeral Got a phone that Rubens remains arrived at Maxville at 10. A. M. and will leave there tomorrow 10. A. M. for Williamstown
- 12 The funeral came about 2. P. M. no one for dinner
- 13 Jimmie went to Lancaster to D. Gans, he paid 5^{cts} for me.
- 14 I paid Jimmie the 5⁰⁰ today Murdy was up the branch 70 2 lbs butter 35 70 2 loaves 12. Cold
- 15 Cold and rain sent an order to Costens 28.45. Jimmie 14. Post off order 15 28-60
