1. Very fine day sent provender to mill and got it home in half an hour sent a letter to Murdy with \$16.00, a telegram, for Far to go to Cornwall
2. Ran & I went to the Gore for dolly & colt when we got there, Far was there, we sent him to Cornwall when we got home we found McKillop sitting by the stove. D.D. conducted prayer meeting
3. Womans meeting at St. C's. I could not go. Far & Ran went to Lancaster for the herring \$1.50 per barrel 35 cts for freight from Montreal. Purchase pig weights 245. got Marion 1 pair rubbers 5.00 at Denis 50
4. Far went for Bird. Hattie came with Kinloch
5. Saturday. Hattie thought to go down by the mail, but it did not call for her. I drove her to Lancaster. I bought at McPhersons Luby 45 at McCommons McKenzi 4 yds flannel 25.00 100 two bunches Cayony yarn 1.00 - 36 36
6. Rev Campbell preached morning text Rom 12 chaps 16 verse, read Prov 3 chaps to the 26 verse. evening read Daniel 3 chaps text 1 Corin 16 chaps 13 verse. Almost every person was pleased
7. McKillop went to Martintown today, he is delivering Rob. Campbells book, St Gabriel at Church. Just now we got one, \$3.00. subscribers will get it for 3.00 but others will have to pay 5.00
8. Far was at the Gore at a be of Uncle Donald's he came home and dressed and went then to the dance. Dan Kennedy died early this morning after 3 days illness. leaves a wife and 7 children
9. Very fine day. put two cows into cry and put in Dan Kennedys the front porch. Prayer meeting, Rev Neal Campbell, read 1 chapter of 1st Peter and part of 2nd Chapter. The Hall was pretty full and we had a very fine address. I think
