night. I had a letter from Jimmie today  
Gave 1<sup>00</sup> toward the Temperance Campaign

28 I am not feeling very well. I am painting  
the kitchen floor piece by piece

29 My cold is very bad. 70 1 gall coal oil 23  
70 3 lbs butter 75. 70 3 lb steak 30 1. 5

30 St. Andrew's day. fine but winds not good  
There is a report that Dan John Lelper  
was married to a French woman, in  
Cornwall on Tuesday, his name is Major  
his father is working Landers place

Settled with #Pidgeon on Saturday. There

4 Fine day. Sunshine all day. look hopeful for the

5 Dull and it is dull the Temperance vote has been  
defeated and all the hopes disappointed such as

6 70 2 lb steak 15 Sent letter to Mary Jane & Daisy 6  
70 3 lbs butter 75. Muddy by Henry 35<sup>00</sup> 75

7 Stormy. Not many in church. My cold is some better  
8 Cold & bright. Pa & I cleaned the pipes of  
the furnace. from the hall to the chimney  
The furnace smoked terribly. Turned very  
cold by evening Muddy was away for  
most of the day. Catholic Holiday

9 8. a M. Mercury down to 14 below zero. On  
the thermometer 22. Bridie butter in oven  
Pella was here over night

10 Cold enough still.  
11 Turned mild with snow. I am getting better  
slowly I made a small flannel washing  
Had a letter from Jimmie

12 Fine bright day. Muddy & #Pidgeon drew 2 loads  
of hay. 70 1 gall coal oil 23<sup>00</sup> 70 beef 35<sup>00</sup> 58

13 Stormy and cold all day. Part of Lancaster butcher  
60 lbs of hind qr of beef at 6 per lb. 3.60 9.60  
John Montroy paid 1<sup>00</sup>. A letter from Marnie  
yesterday. Turned about 3 lbs butter

14 Furnace smoking furiously Muddy had  
to put earnest in a hole. Cold & below  
at 7. a M
