 Went to a Baker to 12 Eggs & 1 Plug Tobacco  
 the rest in Sea (to 2 lb of shot on credit)  
 took Dinner at Yellumous speaking to Captain  
 Newton of the Barge Griswold about the  
 manure let him have my Boat to go  
 and meet the Adolphus she passed up  
 here this morning to go for the Fort Lovings  
 Lacross Club to play in Lancaster. Scuffed with  
 Thomas Murray to Sunday with the  
 4 or 5 of the Commons Myo fixing his shed  
 George and Pete Bosell here seen the Heron  
 told him I found his best. 2<sup>nd</sup> A very warm  
 fine day very warm London and to let the  
 stained Ropes and Butternut shot a Duck  
 and not get it found a couple of staves  
 took Dinner on Ropes Island killed  
 some Black Snakes But did not  
 look after them much as it was shoes  
 had on if it was my Boot I would  
 look after them more a great deal  
 shooting around chutes and Aleescan  
 3<sup>rd</sup> Dams Birth Day and a fine day it is very  
 warm 4<sup>th</sup> Went to Cornwall with A. S. Walker  
 William Mr. Sock's Wife Poorly Doctor Stans  
 attending 5<sup>th</sup> John Angus Birth Day  
 commenced taking up the Potatoes  
 got 2 lb Tea 1 lb Sugar from a Baker  
 the day I went to Cornwall took  
 my Dinner and supper there

 Commenced the Potatoes took up 20 Bushels  
 Day 6<sup>th</sup> this is the last of the 2 day 2 days  
 at the Potatoes took up 10 Bushels to day  
 shot some Ducks 7<sup>th</sup> very Windy Babel and  
 his wife called here as they were going to  
 antique have them some Potatoes took  
 10 Bushels that 40 Bushels out of the place  
 best des what we eat since killed some  
 8<sup>th</sup> shot a Hawk 8<sup>th</sup> when I had with  
 taking the ashes in Bays went around the  
 the Island seen Captain Newton's barge  
 ground loaded with Hoop sand beach  
 all the ashes I hearking to the boys with  
 the Steamer Adol phus came up and  
 assisted in taking them off 10<sup>th</sup> Sunday  
 George and Jim Nicholson here Bantam to Bus  
 Jumper for Sticklers Boat and Mantingto  
 Buy Marsh Hay although it is Sunday  
 11<sup>th</sup> Went with my ashes to James Grant had  
 3<sup>rd</sup> Bushels 15 cents a Bushel a Bought of  
 and Baker 2<sup>nd</sup> shot 20 cents 3 lb Powder 20 cents  
 1 plug Tobacco 4 cents Tin Cup 10 cents a great Pe  
 Nic on Burnt Flows Kout for Sunday school  
 children Peter B Grant Mantingto his Pot  
 seen Luke's own crossed for Thomas  
 to his share as to her Barnett was waiting  
 him 40 Days Revolution in Williamstown now
