

January 1889

Sat Jan 26<sup>th</sup> clear and pleasant we were cutting wood. Sun Jan 27<sup>th</sup> Commenced to snow about 10 A.M. and is snowing now to P.M. about 3 inches of snow now Mon Jan 28<sup>th</sup> Cloudy snow falling lightly most of the day. we were cleaning up wheat some for Market some for Mill. and Shelling corn to get chopt.

Jan 29<sup>th</sup> clear and pleasant. Walter and I went to Thamesville with a small load of wheat. sold it to J. Syers for 9¢ per bushel. Sleighing pretty good part of the way.

Jan 30<sup>th</sup> Cloudy a little snow. I took a load of grain to Mill in the after fore noon was shelling corn and cleaning up grain to get chopt.

Thu Jan 31<sup>st</sup> Cloudy and snow morning and Evening clear in the middle of the day and moderate. I took some grain to Mill to get chopt. and brought back that I took yesterday. we were drawing up wood this after noon.

February 1889

Fri Feb 1<sup>st</sup> cloudy and cool. we were cleaning up grain for feed in the fore noon. after noon Walter and I butchered six small pigs.

Sat Feb 2<sup>nd</sup> cloudy and moderate. Walter went for the chop feed & I was cutting up and sating a pig in the fore noon. after noon we were shelling corn and putting up another load to get chopt.

Sun Feb 3<sup>rd</sup> cloudy and cold. Quarterly meeting at Florence did not attend. no preaching here.

Mon Feb 4<sup>th</sup> cloudy and soft. Snow this Evening. I went to the Quarterly Meeting this after noon

Tue Feb 5<sup>th</sup> a cold blustering day. not doing any thing to day.

Wed Feb 6<sup>th</sup> clear and cold. 3 deg below zero this morning. Dick and I were picking over beans. Walter went for the chop feed.

Thu Feb 7<sup>th</sup> cloudy not as cold as yesterday. we put up a small load of grain to get chopt
