Fri June 24th Clear part of the day and cool. we were working about the hair in the fore noon after noon hoeing corn. Butler finished this fore noon

Mon June 27th Clear and pleasant. we were hoeing corn in the fore noon. Walter commenced to cut grass this after noon. I was hoeing we had new potatoes to day for the first this Season.

Tue June 28th Clear and warm. we was hoeing corn in the fore noon after noon raking up and cocking hay.

Wed June 29th Clear and hot was hoeing corn part of the day part working at hay. Walter finished cutting the little field of grass West of the house. James Carscallen was here putting up the case through

Thu June 30th Clear and very hot. we were drawing in hay. John W. Sweeney and Albert Nelson helping us
