22nd We left after dinner for home called at Uncle G's a few minutes it was very cloudy and windy to-day
23rd I came to Lyndhurst sold H. Singleton a job had dinner at Wm Lloyds 50 cts. came on to Delta called on Miss Johnson then to Phillipsville sold R. C. Haskins
