 Brought here Brought the clock and  
 5 Dozen of 4 in Pans Gota Kluss tobacco  
 gave him a stump of Pine for 7 shillings  
 6 Panning some and wind 3<sup>rd</sup> Mowing  
 4<sup>th</sup> Mowing Cocks and Mowing  
 Burdo settling got 7 1/2 dollars from  
 Mr Durishie dissolved Partnership  
 him and Burdo in fishing 5<sup>th</sup> John  
 Hamilton and misback here  
 I crossed with them 7 am and I  
 went to find the Horse got him  
 up near Cornwall 6<sup>th</sup> Randolph  
 Birth Day 1867 I went from Hamilton  
 to St Regison the steamer Sherry Pracey  
 going and coming only 25 cents went to Glasgow  
 dinner in Mr Giffons store took  
 Miss Jack and Gordon came down home with  
 me and she Rowed the Boat all the way  
 down Mr Horof and here fishing lost his  
 Bottle which he greatly lamented 7<sup>th</sup>  
 fishing in Hay on Roles Horaxest killed  
 8<sup>th</sup> Bushy came went to the head of  
 Island 9<sup>th</sup> got a Bark line from Bushy  
 traded Thrifes Gordon and 2 of Borth here  
 on Sunday yesterday gave him my  
 Gold Pistons got 50 cents  
 found a knife that had been lost  
 for 22 years 10<sup>th</sup> Anne Jack and Gordon  
 here with a letter for Burdo to my  
 care 11<sup>th</sup> 10 Leangy here for Greenboro  
 gave it to him Peter Backshore gave  
 him a 100 cents to have no more  
 do with his horse Royal Lang

Mr James Capelton (uncle) August 12<sup>th</sup>  
 The greatest heat yet the temperature  
 to most awful hot this range date in 1876  
 was also very hot 13<sup>th</sup> some fog at the head of  
 the Island had to get sails to put it  
 out very windy a ridge went up  
 14<sup>th</sup> went to Dundee with 32 3/4 of bulk  
 Borth labour sale 1. 8 1/2 Graham Flour 40 cents  
 Tea 25 Tea 20 Soda 8 Cotton 140 shot 12 1/2 Tub 25 paid  
 for the clock 50 paid for the Bards 2 Day 1. 50  
 pipe 1 hat 1/2 of 50 cent Tea from Sago to Corn  
 Staff at Luke had supper Mrs Burdo here  
 The Aorills Down with their steamer  
 a good breeze sailing across to Day 15<sup>th</sup>  
 Sunday a lot in the Long Black Plover  
 of those folks on the 16<sup>th</sup> Mowing  
 16<sup>th</sup> Mowing Plums Ripening 17<sup>th</sup> shutting in  
 Hay on Roles 18<sup>th</sup> Muncell's 19<sup>th</sup> wire here  
 to trade a Horse went down at night  
 with the old man to take up his Borth  
 of Fish out of the Water Mowens on the  
 Power Point 15<sup>th</sup> Bismarck's Birth  
 Day 1870 Raining before daylight heavy  
 Thunder and lightning Windy fine Rain  
 West Wind Mr Durishie Rowed up  
 from Lancaster with the Princeps  
 following 20<sup>th</sup> Fine went to Hopskins got  
 the Loan of the scow from Jim Got the horse  
 Jim W. Boma Luke and Billy came down with  
 the Horse Brought up the 2 Cows Spotty  
 and Black Brought some Corn to Luke  
 21<sup>st</sup> Wind Rain Thunder Lightning the Bis  
 Place at Dickenson's Island Hamilton and  
 from Toronto for 1000 dollars at head of  
 the Island the Boys Hugham Linn
