Harry & I walked down and went to the station in time to say good-bye to Dorrie. You & I started to see her leave, Chas drove Lizzie down with her & took her up town. Mary & I met her at Aunt's and we drove for home. Mr. Bealey was over to see Mr. Clarke.

Friday August 26<sup>th</sup>

Dad has been ploughing all day and going all the way around the two fields. It is very hard and a slow job. His cutter came off this morning and he had to change at noon which took him a long time as the clewce, were rusted. I dug post holes around the old garden and put posts in. I would have finished to night but I struck a stone just at five o'clock and had to leave it. Left dinner I drove Mr. Clarke down and left him at Uncle W's and went after him this evening. Chas went down to Chas's place to night and Dad went down to see Aunt, who is ever so much better. We Cook had her & Aunty Alice over here for a dinner this afternoon.

Dad and I have been all day putting up the fence between the old meadow north of the old garden and the out stubble and around the north & west side of the garden so that the cows can't get in although there is precious little
