9 I Chored & harrowed turnip ground Joe Drew dung I took girl home after supper she is not well. W. Clear
10 Little John rolled turnip ground Joe rolled get field near Hoover's & part of spring wheat with C B's roller I & bag Cut seed Potatoes P.M. W. Clear

Mother-in-law & Peter were here awhile P.M.
11 I finished rolling spring wheat this morning took C B's roller home then sorted & cut some Potatoes Joe Drew dung W. Cool. a little rain

12 I went to Markham A.M. B's C & I went with me to station they are going to Clinton I brought 650 2 in tiles after supper W. Cool

13 Brought 350 2 in tiles A.M. sowed some land salt on part of spring wheat & took 10 bus Peas to B's I to get Chopped after supper W. Clear Cool
Joe finished churning dung & harrowed potato ground
My Mother is at B's No more they brought her here ^{ground} this P.M. to visit us. she is quite smart she says she feels like another being. sets pretty well

Sunday 14 at home all day Simon Hoover's were here P.M. W. fine warm Clear

15 Both began plowing fallow. W. fine Clear

16 Chored. W. rain untill about 3 P.M. then Joe brought home Pea Chop & I went to Belgrad

17 Plowed. I went to Cedar Grove after supper W. rain until about 9 A.M. fine morning

18 Both plowed. W. fine Clear

19 I & Sam Ramey went fishing to Imanis bay with Troll hooks. bad day for Trolling. got none. Fished with worm bait got about 2 dozen fine fish. then went to Duffins Creek. Caught 1. then went to Range. Caught 11 then came home about sunset well satisfied with our days. Spent W.

20 Planted Potatoes. we are planting ^{the} them late trying to evade the Colorado beetle they are very numerous this year. W. fine Clear

Sunday 21 Went to Meeting at Nelson Nancy staid with my Mother. she came home again this morning

22 Finished planting Potatoes & I went to J. D's raising P.M. Joe began making turnip drills P.M. W. very warm

Hoover's had came awhile this morning with D. Prider & Gotschall & wife from the States I went to J. Burrows with Mare Jess

23 I sowed some turnip this morning Packed Potato bugs & scuffled Corn & Early Potatoes Joe plowed in fallow. W. very warm, sultry

24 I finished fallow except endlands Joe finished making turnip drills I took great Oats to B's I's after supper W. fine Cool

25 I finished sowing turnip Joe plowed headlands in fallow then hoed Corn I helped him awhile P.M. W. fine Cool. a nice shower P.M.

26 Chored & Cleaned head spring wheat A.M. I took it to Cedar Grove mills (A.D. 12) P.M. Joe went to Party at Cherrywood P.M. W. Dried all A.M.

27 I went to Markham & then to Unionville to Township Clerk to Register Babry's name & Birth Call her. Esther. I & Joe drew some logs from near dam to saw for wood P.M. W. warm Clear

went to J. D's with my Mother after supper
Sunday 28 at home all day. A B's were here this evening & B's I's & J. D's youngsters P.M. I took Frank to Burrows this evening to get a Ball put into him. he is lame. W. very warm

29 hoed feed Corn A.M. Joe went to another Milling at Cherrywood P.M. I took some parts of repairs to Mongolia to get repaired. got supper at O. Lehman's. W. pretty warm
