Bismarck's Birth Day 1870. 31 years old to day
Fine Day East Wind Moving in the Back Marsh Note
2 Letters to Day Ed Kershaw here took them to the P.O.
The Steamer Gracie Fishing around here had their
Supper at the Head of the Island I treated me
as I passed by Began to Rain through the night
and Rained very hard 20th Unfortunate Day
Damp Raining got 1 Sturgeon 1 Pickerel 2 Eels on
the Line Fixing up one of the Doors Mr Genie
here got Birtes Fishing at the Little Island
East Wind got a Rat 21st Foggy Morning
East Wind putting the Pile of Boards outside up
Stairs I went to head of the Island 2 Ellen
here Mr Lanagin or Lanorgan and Frank Barnhart
for Cattle got 2 Steers and the Pet Lamb Killed
above the yard in the Woods Ed Kershaw
here got the Bun a Fine Day Leander went
up with Mr Lonegan 14.10.2.75 26.75 100th
Dried Apples got a Piece of the Meat from
Mr Lamingham 22nd Fine Mr Grange and 2
of the Birch Girls with him Brought a lot
of Newspapers to me got ice 25 Turned to
Rain Thunder and Lightning East Wind changed
to South and West The Dredge to 6 lbs of
Butter 1.20 this the first to begin with
the Dredge Mr Barnhart to 2 lb of Butter 40
1 1/2 doz of Eggs 18 Paid first quarter 23rd Fine
Mr M. Lennan and George Creamer here Brought
a Washing Machine Livinia (Senor) Bought
4 Dollars Paid The Dredge came this Morning
Drawing the Sticks of the old Barn

hard Thunder Mr M. Lennan and George Fishing
Rained to get a Letter from Miss Jessie May of

Livinia not well Leander and Stanley not well

Landing Most awful Warm to Day 2 Wind
28th St Augustine's Day Very Fine Morning
The Dredge to 5 lb Butter 5 lb Ice 40

Ice 10 2 Doz of Eggs Mr Grange and sister for Ice 20
Brought me a lot of Newspapers Mr-
Webster came up this Morning Tonie
crossed to Sumnerstown Bought 1 pair Boots
1 Bottle of Pain-killer got a Letter from
the Actina and a Book free 3 of them
crossed to Randolph's I sent for a pipe 1 Cent
2 came back 1 Stopt 29th Fine West Wind
Leander crossed to go with Adeliade to
F Covington to get her Teeth Pulled Stanley
Cutting the Oats The Flat Leander took over 35 worth
of Butter to some one Lewis's for Butter 50 Sent for
Essence of Peppermint 10 cents Leander came
