

Broton December 1887

Tue Dec 27<sup>th</sup> cloudy and moderate. we were putting up a load of grain to get chopt in the fore noon. after noon I took to the Florence mill.

Registered a money letter to Rev William Briggs Toronto to day of the Guardian and Methodist Magazine and Life of Cushey

Wed Dec 28<sup>th</sup> Snow high wind and blustering was thrashing peas most of the day.

Thu Dec 29<sup>th</sup> clear high wind and cold. I was thrashing peas part of the fore noon. we were cleaning up peas part of the day. Sent for the Ohio Farmer to day.

Fri Dec 30<sup>th</sup> cloudy and cool. in the fore noon I was digging a hole in the straw stack for the old sow to have her pigs. after noon went for the chop feed

Sat Dec 31<sup>st</sup> Snow from the East most of the day not doing any thing to day.

Broton January 1888

Sun Jan 1<sup>st</sup> cloudy windy and cold in the afternoon. rain last night and this fore noon took most of the snow of.

Mon Jan 2<sup>nd</sup> cloudy and cold. not doing much this fore noon. after noon was thrashing out peas.

Tue Jan 3<sup>rd</sup> clear most of the day and pleasant. was thrashing out peas in the fore noon after noon chopping wood

Wed Jan 4<sup>th</sup> cloudy and moderate. we were sawing stove wood this fore noon. after noon attended Albert Boyingtons sale

Thu Jan 5<sup>th</sup> cloudy and cool. we were sawing stove wood.

Fri Jan 6<sup>th</sup> cloudy rain fore part of the day. every thing covered with ice. not doing any thing to day. I sold to John Bedford of Wabash four breeding Ewes at Seven Dollars a head.
