Mucus.—Mucus in the respiratory tract is sometimes very distressing, the patient who has had an abdominal operation being unable to use sufficient muscular effort to cough it up. A simple expedient is to hold the patient upright in bed, firmly supporting the abdomen by encircling his waist from behind. Braced in this way, the patient can rid himself of the troublesome mucus with little discomfort.—*Balfour; Mayo Clinic. Med. Record.*
