Mucus.—Mucus in the respiratory tract is sometimes very distressing, the patient who has had an abdominal operation being unable to use sufficient muscular effort to cough it up. A simple expedient is to hold the patient upright in bed, firmly supporting the abdomen by encircling his waist from behind.
