commenced on our
last field the New
Ground.

I spent most of
the forenoon looking
and enquiring after
a girl back my
efforts, so far as I
could see, were fruit-
less. My two girls
leaving as we are
left in a helpless
fix. Mother is not
at all able to do our
work, without help.
Mary Jane is with
us now. This is a
great help for this time
being but she cannot
stay long.

WEDNESDAY, MAY 17, 1870.

I plowed a part of
the new ground the
day and we got it
nearly harrowed up.
This afternoon mother
saw a weasel off in
reach of a girl. I
left Mr. Jarvis
and went on down
to Dick's. Found some
consolation in the
prospect of getting one
of their girls to help
us.
