Sun. Tues 1 Very cold. Walter was busy opening the road this morning. We went to Woolwich Church and Sunday school this afternoon.

Mon. Wed-2 Very cold. Ella did her washing. Walter was on the road nearly all day and killed a beef tonight. Ausley Laukin called on him and Elmo King was here for supper. Norman Henderson and Irvin Snider visited Vernon this afternoon.

Tues.—Thur 3 Beautiful day with lovely sunshine. Walter was butchering at Koepke's today. Callers were - Henry Shedewitz and Geo Schwindt.

Wed. Fri 4 Snowed this morn- ing. Rained hard all after-noon. Walter went to Creekbank this morning and killed a beef at Noah Miller's this afternoon. Otto Miller called on Walter.

Thur. Sat 5 Cold & stormy. Walter shipped pigs from Elmira for the first time today and got home at 2 p.m. His callers were - Jus. Staugey and Jack Harrington

JANUARY, 1918 CASH ACCOUNT

Fri. Sun 6 Snowing. Walter called at his father's place this afternoon. Lincoln Edna, Willard and Mildred Weaver were here for the afternoon and supper. Other callers were - Joe Hall and Annie Snider.

Sat. Mon 7 Beautiful, perfect day. Walter went to Alma to Borovay's sale this afternoon. Emerson Staugey visited Vernon today Other callers – Jas. Snider and Alberta Allgeier.

Sun. Tues 8 Changeable weather We had Arletta's turkey for dinner and had the following company - Mr. & Mrs. Jus. Maurer, Miriam Maurer, Mr. & Mrs. Ezra Maurer, Mr. & Mrs. Jno. Staugey and Emerson.

Mon. Wed-9 Fair. Walter went to Elmira this morn-ing and returned at 6.30 p.m. Callers were – Louis and Charlie Miller Wm. Ritter died this morn- ing at Floradale.

Tues. Thur 10 Perfect sunshiny day. Walter was butchering today at Jus Maurer's. Ella did her washing

Wed. Fri 11 Fair. Cold east wind Walter killed a beef at his father's place and took it to Elora. Charles Hilliard came up and stayed for the night. Other callers - Louis Miller Enoch Snider, Mr. Grasser, Annie Snider & Lizzie Koepke.

Thur. Sat 12 Clear and cold. Walter and Charlie left for Elmira at 7 oclock. Walter killed a beef for Enoch Snider when he got back also fetched some pigs at Edmund Schwindt and Hy. Shedewitz.

JANUARY, 1918 CASH ACCOUNT

Fri. Sun-13 Fair. Some snow flurries. We butchered Geo Snider's pig here today. Enoch Snider helped and was here for din-ner too. Aaron Martin called on Walter.

Sat. Mon 14 Very cold and stormy. Walter took a drive up the 8th of Peel this forenoon and up to Creekbank before supper. Geo Snider visited him this afternoon and Harvey and Lorne Reist visited Vernon.

Sun. Tues-15 Very stormy. We drove to church with Enoch Snider's in the big sleigh this afternoon Henry Gross died at Floradale today.

Mon. Wed 16 Walter butchered two pigs at Addison Reist's today. Our callers - Nick Hoffer and Walter Fulton.

Tues. Thur 17 Water went to Floradale with chopping this morning and to Elmira for a ton of corn this afternoon. Two men from Kitchener got stuck with a truck in the snow and were here for dinner.

Wed Fri-18 Snowing. Walter butchered three pigs at Enoch Snider's today. Irvin fetched Ella and Vernon and they were there for supper too. Caller - Geo. Norman

Thurs. Sat-19 Raw and cold. Walter shipped pigs at Elmira today and took some pig up to Larkin's. Jno Staugey called on Walter this afternoon Stormy this afternoon and evening

JANUARY, 1918 CASH ACCOUNT

Fri. Sun 20 Fair and cold. Walter butchered a beef this morning and went to Ausley Larkin's sale this afternoon. Ella went along and stayed at Lincoln's Vernon came there after school and we all had supper there. Harvey Schmidt called on Walter.

Sat. Mon 21 Fine day and somewhat mild. Walter fetched the steer at Larkin's, dressed it & I took eight quarters of beef to Elora. Elmo King was here for dinner Callers - Louis Miller, Nick Hoffers & Edmund Schwindt & Enoch Snider.

Sun. Tues 22 Very stormy. It is blowing a mixture of snow and dirt today. No church services in Woolwich on account of the storm

Mon. Wed 23 Fair and very cold. This has been a remarkable day in the history of the Maurer's. Walter was at home all day and had no visitors.

Tues. Thur 24 Clear and very cold. Ella did her washing. Walter & Jack Harrington took 2 loads of turnips to Alma this morning and Walter went to Ed. Hobberthein's sale after dinner.

Wed. Fri 25 Clear and very cold Walter took a load of turnips to Alma this morning and went to Rube Eby's sale this afternoon. Callers were - Lizzie Koepke Annie Snider, Margaret Beuder and Wilkie Campbell. Rev. E.N. Beau was here for tea.

Thur. Sat 26 Cold east wind blowing Walter was shipping hog at Elmira today. Annie Snider went down with him and hand dinner here. Norman King was here for supper. Walter killed a beef for him.

JANUARY, 1918 CASH ACCOUNT

Fri. Sun 27 Very cold. Walter butchered at Edmund Schwindt's today.

Sat Mon 28 Lovely day. Somewhat milder. Walter has a bad cold. He's callers - Wilkie Campbell Bob and Ben Conrad Hahn Irvin & Eva Snider, Edmund Schwindt, Vernon and Keneth Vernon visited King's this afternoon.

Sun. Tues 29 Beautiful day. We drove to church with Enoch's in the sleigh. Rev. Crawford of New York State preached today,

Mon. Wed 30 Beautiful sunny day. Walter went to Josiah Brubacher's today to fetch some pigs. Walter's callers- Noah Miller.

Tues. Thur 31 Another perfect day. Walter went to Kopes sale at Goldetone this afternoon. Callers were - Mrs. Jno. N. Miller and Edmund Schwindt.

Wed. Fri 1 FEBRUARY Cloudy and mild. Rained tonight. We were up to Geo. Snider for a pork roast this evening. Born - To Mr. & Mrs. Noah Miller a daughter Orpha Alberta

Thurs Sat 2 Snowing & blowing. Walter was shipping hogs from Elmira, went to St. Jacobs with the train and returned at 2 p.m.

FEBRUARY, 1918 CASH ACCOUNT

Fri. Sun 3 Snowing and blowing all day. Walter went down to Woelfle's this afternoon and got Polly shod.

Sat. Mon 4 Snowflurries. Walter took a load of chopping to Floradale this afternoon. Vernon spent the afternoon at Addison Reist's. Lincoln Edler was here for dinner.

Sun. Tues 5 Fair. Mr & Mrs, Otto Miller, Laura & Norman visited us today and were here for dinner & supper.

Mon Wed 6 Cold. Walter's callers were - Nick Hoffer Louis and Charlie Miller.

Tue. Thur 7 Cold and windy. Walter butchered a pig for Louis Miller's. Callers were - Cecil Jackson and Joe Lawson.

Wed. Fri 8 Fair. Some snow- flurries. Ella did her wash ing today. Walter took two loads of turnips to Alma today.

Thurs. Sat 9 Beautiful spring - like day. Walter shipped hog from Elmira today and got home after 6 p.m. Elmo King was here for supper and Mr. & Mrs. Craig and Julia visited us after supper.

FEBRUARY, 1918 CASH ACCOUNT

Fri. Sun 10 Mild. Lincoln Edna, Willard & Mildred came down and we butchered a pig and made sausage for them today. Born - To Mr & Mrs. Jacob Good, St. Jacobs, a son. Harold Wagner.

Sat. Mon 11 Cold & windy. Walter worked in the stables nearly all day and he and Vernon went to Creekbank this after noon.

Sun. Tues 12 Cold. Very cold piercing east wind blowing Walter & Vernon went to Woolwich church and Sunday school this afternoon. Mr. Buchanan a Temperance speaker, spoke.

Mon. Wed-13 Cold. Snowflurries Walter took five pigs to The Fair and sold them, also shipped his hide. Callers were - E. Bell, Pete and Gordon Roy.

Tues. Thur 14 Fair and cold. Snowflurries. We butchered 2 pigs here for Pete Roy. Walter's caller was - Mr. Whitlaw.

Wed. Fri 15 Fair and cold. Snowflurries. Ella did her washing today. Walter butchered 2 pigs at E. Bell's. Callers were - Pete Roy & Noah Shoe - maker.

Thur Sat 16 Very cold. Clear and windy. Walter was shipping pigs today from Elmira

FEBRUARY, 1918 CASH ACCOUNT

Fri Sun 17 Very cold. Very cold east wind blowing. Walter worked in the stables and went to Creekbank this afternoon.

Sat. Mon 18 Lovely, spring- like day. Walter took a load of chopping to Floradale and brought along Cyril Bristow of Moncton, Ont.

Sun. Tues 19 Misty & dreamy, We went to church this morn-ing and to Lincoln's for a while this afternoon and came home in a shower of rain, thunder, lightning and hail this afternoon.

Mon. Wed-20 Fair and cold. Walter was butchering at Noah Miller's and our Lord Cyril did the chores and reclined at ease on the couch the rest of the time.

Tues. Thur 21 Lovely day. Ella did her washing Walter was chopping today. His callers were – Henry Ziegler and Enoch Snider.

Wed. Fri-22 Thunder and light- ing last night. Rain and sleet all day. Walter went to Henry Hedrich's sale near Elmira. Telephones on the blink thoughtout the whole of Ontario.

Thurs. Sat 23 Rain and sleet all day. Colder tonight. Very icy. Walter shipped pigs today. Ella saw a large flock of crows today.

FEBRUARY, 1918 CASH ACCOUNT

Fri Sun 24 Lovely day. Cold and clear. Walter & Cyril went to Floradale with a load of chopping this afternoon.

Sat Mon 25 Lovely day. Clear and cold. Walter spent the day gallivanting around the country. He had his dinner at Lincoln Weavers and got home for supper at 7.30 p.m.

Sun. Tues 26 Lovely day. Clear and cold. Walter, Ella & Vernon went to Wool- wich church & S.S. this after-noon

Mon. Wed 27 Cloudy. Some snow flurries. Ella did her washing. Walter spent the day on the road. Vernon felt ill so he stayed home from school and spent the most of the day in bed. Born - To Mr & Mrs. Lincoln Weaver a daughter Doris Lauriree Nellie

Tues. Thur 28 Very cold & stormy. Walter connected some of the vines and we can {illegible} with some of the neighbours again Walter went to Martin Bowman's sale.

Wed Fri 1 MARCH Cloudy raw and cold. Walter went to Kavanagh's this morning and to Woelfle's this afternoon. Callers - Mrs. Kells and Pete Roy.

Thur. Sat 2 Lovely sunshiny day. Walter shipped hogs at Elmira today and got back at 7 p.m. and brought Father Krauter home with him and took a quilt by surprise

MARCH, 1918 CASH ACCOUNT

Fri. Sun 3 Lovely sunshiny day. Walter fetched a load of corn at Elmira this morning and butchered a pig for us this afternoon. Arthur Cragg was our caller.

Sat. Mon 4 Lovely spring-like day. Walter took a load of turnips down to Elmira this afternoon and went to Clement's after supper.

Sun. Tues 5 Lovely spring-like day. We went to church this morning and went to Lincoln Weaver's for the afternoon and for supper. Father Krauter went up to Lincoln's this morning.

Mon. Wed 6 Fair. Ella did her washing & rinsing today. Walter took a load of turnips to Elmira this morning and one up to Lincolns this afternoon. Cyril went to Emerson Grose's tonight for a week on trial and stayed two days. (Good Riddance).

Tues. Thur 7 Somewhat colder. Snowflurries. Walter was out looking for horses this morning and did the chores this afternoon also helped a passing motorist. Father Krauter came down here from Lincoln's and Jno. Schwindt visited Walter

Wed. Fri 8 Clear, cold and windy. Walter went to Becker's sale this afternoon. Noah Miller visited us this aft evening.

Thur. Sat 9 Fine spring-like day. Walter shipped pigs from Elmira today and took Father Krauter along. as far as Elmira. Ida sent me a pretty gingham dress for a present. Vernon started to school again this morning

Sat Mon 11 Fine weather. Walter went up to Mehlonald{?} and bought a bay mare named Flora. Vernon called at King's and Geo. Snider's today.

Sun. Tues-12 Lovely day. We went to Woolwich church and Sunday School this afternoon.

Mon. Wed 13 Fair and mild. Ella did her washing today. Walter went to Elmira Monthly Fair today Callers were - Ms. Fairweather Geo. Schwindt, Solomon Beuder, Jno and Emerson Staugey.

Tues. Thur 14 Fair and mild. We butchered a pig for Jno. Staugey here today. Aubrey Lawson was here for dinner and Isaac Martin for supper. Other callers - Jacob King, Geo. Snider and Jno. Staugey. Saw song sparrows and blackbirds today.

Wed. Fri 15 Clear, cold and windy. Walter visited the Kavanagh's this afternoon. Callers were – Jno Staugey and Jno. N. Miller.

Thur Sat 16 Very cold & windy Snowflurries. Walter shipped hogs from Elmira today, Mr. Wideman of Balsam Grove was here and bought 3 heifers from him. Geo. Edler visited us after supper.

MARCH, 1918 CASH ACCOUNT

Fri. Sun-17 Very cold. Walter's callers were Geo. & Charlie Maurer. Annie & Eva Snider visited Ella.

Sat Mon 18 Very cold. Walter, Vernon and Charlie Miller took three head of cattle down to Balsam Grove. Walter went to a sale at Alma this after- noon.

Sun. Tues 19. Cold, Raw east wind blowing. Started to rain this afternoon. Maurer's spent the day at home.

Mon. Wed-20 Nasty. gloomy day. Started to snow this evening. Walter went to Creekbank this morning and butchered 2 pigs for Louis Miller's this afternoon Vernon saw a kildeer today. Born - Jo Mr, & Mrs. Norman King a daughter - Violet Loraine

Tues. Thur-21 Snowing and blowing. Very cold. Walter went to Floradale this morn- ing and to Miller's sale at Alma in the afternoon. Walter had eleven callers today. Vernon is ill again and spent the day in bed.

Wed. Fri 22 Clear and very cold. Walter spent the day at home. His callers were - Nick Hoffer, Christ, Hartwing, Norman Martin and Loui's Miller.

Thur Sat-23 Fine day. Milder Walter shipped hogs at Elmira today, took a heifer to Elmira for Hartwig and brought home a horse. Ella did her washing and ironing. James Kavanagh called on Walter.

MARCH, 1918 CASH ACCOUNT

Fri. Sun 24 Fine day. We butchered an old sow for Edler's today and she was one tough nut. Henry Geisel was here and bought the Flora mare from Walter.

Sat. Mon-25 Fair and mild. Walter & Vernon went to Louis Miller's to make the summer sausages and stayed for dinner. Walter took Flora down to Geisel's. Herbie Miller spent the afternoon here

Sun Tues 26 Fair. We saw some meadowlarks today Ella and Vernon spent the day at Lincoln Weaver's. Jno. Staugey and Jacob King called on Walter this after- noon. We moved here four years ago.

Mon Wed 27 Miserable day. Raining. Walter was traipsing around all day looking for horses. The callers were- Joe Lawson and Geo. Snider.

Tues. Thur-28 Gloomy day. Started to rain this evening Ella was quilting today and Mrs. Hoffer and Mrs. Jno. Staugey helped. Walter went to Creekbank this morning. They saw two robins today

Wed Fri-29 Colder. Walter and Ezra went to Em. Matthew's sale and Bert stayed here and helped me finish the quilt and they were here for supper. Born to Mr. & Mrs. Addison Reist a daughter Alma Reist.

Thurs Sat-30 Snowflurries & sleet all day. Nasty weather Walter shipped hogs from Elmira today Callers were – Henry Kliuck, Mr. Henderson and Geo. Edler.

MARCH, 1918 CASH ACCOUNT

Fri. Sun-31 Rain and sleet. Walter worked around the barn today, fetched Vernon home from school and called at the store. The neighbours had a surprise party for Pete Roy's but we didn't go.

Sat Mon 1 APRIL Cold. Everything is covered with ice. The telephone is on the bum again. Walter took a load of chopping to Floradale this afternoon

Sun. Tues 2 Fine day. We went to Woolwich church & S.S. this morning, to Ezra Maurer's for dinner and to Jno. Maurer's for supper. They had a roast goose for supper.

Mon. Wed 3 Fair. Ella did her washing today and cleaned Aubrey's room. Aubrey Lawson, of Winfield our new hired man arrived today. Jno. & Ezra Maurer were here for dinner.

Tues. Thur 4 Misty & dreary. Walter & Aubrey went to Bery. Lichty's sale this afternoon and Walter bought a corn cultivator.

Wed. Fri 5 Dreary misty day. Walter was butchering today on the 16th. of Peel for Mr. Davison and Mr. Archibald.

Thur Sat 6 Quite nice day. Ella went to Elmira today with Walter and had her teeth filled at Dr. Hill's We had our dinner at Art. Kliuck's. We saw some blue - birds today.

APRIL, 1918 CASH ACCOUNT

Fri Sun 7 Mild. Thunder- storms, rain and hail. Aubrey took a load of chopping to Floradale and Walter went to Woelfle's & Ben Millers.

Sat Mon 8 Grand warm day. The men were haul- ing stones into the lane Vernon spent the afternoon at Addison Reists. Walter & Ella went up to Cragg's and Clement's this afternoon. Heard the frogs for the first time tonight.

Sun. Tues 9 Beautiful spring day. Walter, Ella & Vernon went to Woodwich church this afternoon. Lincoln, Edna, Willard Mildred and Doris Weaver were here for tea. Aubrey went to Winfield this evening

Mon Wed 10 Beautiful mild day. Walter went to the Monthly fair today. Mr. Geo. Mogk came up with him and was here for dinner. Ella did her washing.

Tues Thurs 11 Heavy downpour of rain last night. Showery today. The men were cleaning seed grain. His callers - Alonzo & Clayton Miller, and Mr. Riff.

Wed. Fri-12 Colder. Windy with snowflurries. The men were cleaning seed grain. Walter's callers were – Christian Clements and Enoch Snider

Thur. Sat-13 Dreary. Raw and cold. Walter shipped pigs from Elmira today and Aubrey was drawing gravel into the lane.

APRIL, 1918 CASH ACCOUNT

Fri. Sun-14 Good Friday. Lovely morning. Cloudy afternoon. Walter was pruning fruit trees and Aubrey was drawing gravel. It started to rain tonight.

Sat Mon 15 Cold & windy. Aubrey had a holiday today and Walter was hauling gravel. Walter, Ella & Vernon went to Creekbank tonight.

Sun. Tues 16 Clear, cold & windy. We went to Woolwich church this morning. Easter Sunday. We spent the day at Geo. Schwindt's and Sam Bird's were also there. Edna had Doris to church for the first time today.

Mon. Wed 17 Thunderstorms & rain this forenoon. Cleaned up after dinner. Ella & Vernon drove up to Grand- pa Krauter's this after- noon. The St. Jacobs Flour Mill burned down tonight.

Tues Thur 18 Very windy. Shower and snowflurries. Ella & Vernon spent the day at Grandpa's Walter was mending grain bags and Aubrey was drawing gravel.

Wed. Fri-19 Clear and windy. Ella & Vernon got home today at about 11.30 a.m. We did the washing this afternoon and planted some shrubs. Started to snow tonight. Walter went to Lincoln Edler's sale today.

Thur.—Sat 20 Fierce snow - storm today. Walter started for Elmira this morning, got stuck in the snowbank, and went back home. Aubrey helped Elmo King cleaning seed- grain this afternoon

APRIL, 1918 CASH ACCOUNT

Fri. Sun 21 Clear and cold The men hauled home wood with the sleigh for a while this morning. After dinner Walter went to Creekbank and Alma with Jno. Staugey and Aubrey was haul- ing gravel.

Sat. Mon 22 Cloudy and raw. Snowflurries. Aubrey was hauling gravel. Walter & Ella went to Elmira this afternoon.

Sun. Tues 23 Raw cold wind blowing. Ezra, Bert and Miriam were here for awhile this afternoon. We went up to Lincoln Weaver's for a little while after supper.

Mon. Wed 24 Beautiful day. Ella finished cleaning the upstairs today. Walter & Jno. Staugey were driving around the country this afternoon Grandpa Krauter came up here this afternoon

Tues. Thur 25 Lovely day. Ella did her washing this morning and cleaned the yard and planted the sweet peas this afternoon. Grandpa went up to Lincoln's this afternoon. Josiah Brubacher was here for dinner.

Wed. Fri 26 Cloudy. A few showers. Walter butchered a pig for Cragg's this morning and hauled gravel this afternoon. Aubrey attended Thelma Aylustock's {?} funeral this afternoon. Father Krauter went home today

Thur. Sat-27 Clear. Cold north wind blowing. Walter spent the day in Elmira Aubrey was hauling gravel.

APRIL, 1918 CASH ACCOUNT

Fri. Sun 28 Clear and windy. Walter & Aubrey were plowing. Jerome Kavanagh was here for supper.

Sat. Mon 29 Clear and windy. Walter & Aubrey were plowing this forenoon. Aubrey took a load of chopping to Floradale and Walter put the fence around the yard. W & Jno. Staugey went to Kavanagh tonight and Aubrey & Vernon to Creekbank

Sun Tues 30 Lovely day. We went to Woolwich church & S. School this morning. Rev. J.P. Hauch of Kitchener preached. We had company for dinner Lincoln Weaver's and family and Geo. Edler.

Mon. Wed-1 MAY Lovely day. Walter was plowing and Aubrey was cultivating. Ella was digging in the garden and sowed some seeds. Charlie & Schaefer was here for dinner.

Tues Thur 2 Lovely warm day. Aubrey was cultivating and Walter planted seeding at noon. Ella made her flower beds and sewed her seeds.

Wed Fri 3 Cloudy. Shower of rain after supper. The men were working on the land. Ella did her washing today.

Thurs Sat 4 Fair and warm. Aubrey was harrowing all day. Walter was shipped pigs from Elmira Ella was working in the garden and Walter finished the digging for her when he got back

MAY, 1918 CASH ACCOUNT

Fri. Sun 5 The men were seeding. Ella planted onions, peas beans today. Arbor Day at School. Ella mowed the lawn for the first time today.

Sat. Mon 6 Thunderstorms and showers this afternoon The men were seeding. Ella & Vernon planted the gladiolus bulbs today. Walter & Aubrey went to Creekbank after supper.

Sun Tues 7 Windy, cold and drizzly. Miserable day. We intended going to Hilliard's today but had to stay home on account of the weather

Mon. Wed 8 Lovely day. Ella did her washing. Walter took 10 little pigs to the Fair and cold them to Wm. Kuhn for \$55. Aubrey was cultivating, Walter's father came here to fetch some seed grain and was here for supper.

Tues Thur-9 Very windy. The men were seeding Ella cleaned the parlor today.

Wed. Fri-10 Lovely warm day. The men finished seeding today. Ella cleaned the dining room today Lincoln brought Mother Krauter here this afternoon and she is staying for the night.

Thur Sat 11 Warm & Windy. Walter took Mother down to St. Jacobs this morning. Ella planted the dahlias today, also varnished the linoleum. Aubrey was harrowing and Walter was rolling.

MAY, 1918 CASH ACCOUNT

Fri. Sun 12 Lovely day. The men plowed the garden this morning and Ella planted the early potatoes. They plowed the orchard this afternoon. Mr. Menno Dohmer, Mr. & Mrs. Geo. Glennie were here for tea.

Sat. Mon 13 Beautiful day. Aubrey sowed the orchard and Walter was making fence. Aubrey left for the weekend this evening, Walter, Ella and Vernon went to Creekbank after supper.

Sun. Tues 14 Lovely day. We left this morning called at Geo. Glennie's and all went down to Hilliard's in their car. We went to Conestogo Methodist church this afternoon. Big Fire in Elmira. Part of business section burned down

Mon Wed-15 Lovely day, Ella did her washing and planted corn, melons, beans and pumpkins The men were picking stones.

Tues. Thur 16 Lovely day. The men were picking stones. Ella did her ironing. We went over to King's and up to Creekbank after supper.
