

August 17 Rev. W. Robinson preached this morning Matthews in the evening

- 18 drew in 2 loads of oats & some hay Flenery cut on Saturday
- 19 Flenery went to Malby town with a load of cheese for Storey
- 20 began to cut the wheat with the reapers it was laying so bad we could not do good work we went at it with the scythes
- 21 Flenery finished cutting the wheat to day we drew in 2 loads of it I got 2 shoes on Sunday
- 22 gathered the wheat into winnrows with the flints & 3 loads it was rather thin owing to the drought
- 23 Flenery raked the wheat fields with the horse rake in the forenoon then cut oats Flumph helped him in the afternoon I went to Gouanquer to an agricultural meeting
- 24 the Rev. W. Matthews preached this morning Rev. W. DeLong in the evening I went to the River to hear Rev. W. Rock
- 25 drew in 2 loads of oats that was cut on Saturday & cut a piece in the north east corner
- 26 cut more of the oats & drew in 1 load dull & cloudy
- 27 A Cornet & Shumphor Younger helped Flenery to cut the oats they finished the cutting fine day I attended a meeting in the church the Rev. W. Colthore lectured Rev. W. Burton came from Belville to see about raising money to have a minister for a year there was a good many out
- 28 raked & drew in 5 large loads Shumph helped I raked with John Johnston's steel rake it will not work in the furrows or where the wheel is of the level
- 29 Shumph & Flenery worked at the peas I raked the winnrows where the waggon went in the forenoon went to Gouanquer to see W. Colthore in the afternoon
- 30 went to Delta with W. Deon & Mrs. Jean they are going to her father's at Newborough Shumph & Flenery finished cutting the peas the Rev. W. DeLong preached this morning & the Rev. W. Matthews a night the church was full & some standing in St. Peter's
- 31 heavy this morning
