- 18. Sent a letter to Marion. Got one to day from her. It rained all last night and drizzled all this day. When Jimmie went out to the stable this morning he found the yearling colt could not get up. When they got it up it could only stand on three feet. He called Downmalle to see it he thought it must have broken its leg. and he is bathing it with cold water. He had Dixon looking at her, he thinks it is rheumatism. 70 2 loaves 10
- 19. Dull and misty. 1/2 lb tea 20 egg 10
- 20. Still dull. This is the day of Bennings sale of Ayrshire cattle. Evening the sale came off. The sale amounted to 12,000. one cow young for 500. a bull for 400. some weaning calves for 90. yearling heifers for 200
- 2-1. Fine warm day. Sent \$1.60 to Toronto for the Presbyterian. Sold 2 day eggs - 36. 70 ginger 10
cream tartar 10 biscuits 16 Butter 1.06
Postal note 4 - 3 loaves - 75 1.32 19
- 22. Dull. Sunday Rosean died at 11. A. M.
- 23. 1 gal wal oil 20 Bacon 3 loaves 15
Murdy got fish (perch from little Sullivan) Far and Jean came at 8.30. P. M.
- 24. J. P. Macchi and Agnes came to preaching. There was service in the church for the funeral which was very largely attended. John Robertson N. Branch was in for a short time. I sent 72⁰⁰ by Telegraph to Coburns for Ab. to pay 2 years of the Standard up until this fall
- 25. Murdy left for Maxville by morning train. Got a hen on Birdies eggs

- 26. Rained all day. not very heavy at any time
- 27. Ann Hall 1/2 day 30^{cts} 70 2 loaves 10 40
- 28. Murdy got home at noon. J. P. here to dinner gave him our milk can the big one. Hard frost 5
- 29. 70 Electric oil 25. bread 10. Put fire in furnace tonight. it is quite cold. had fire last night. I took a fresh cold on Wednesday fixing a hen on a nest. Tomorrow is the last day for the licenses. And there is quite a lot of drinking going on in the village. 70 pot ash tablets 5^{cts} 70 6 loaves 25
- 30. 70 2 lbs butter 60^{cts} 1/2 lb tea 20. I am not feeling very well today.
On Friday the 29th about 2. a.m. The Rosemore house in Cloonwall was discovered to be on fire. it spread so rapidly, that the people who got out had a hard time of it. There were 11 persons burned. One family of Grays were all burned. Man wife two children Alick R. MacKeenan wife and child got out by climbing down on a rope
