Finished the Acorn Raining 24th took
up the poles about 7 Bushels of them took
some some wood with the Acorn on 25th Sunday
South West Wind high Captain Rankin did not come
up with Frank Lapham Black Cherries falling
26th Digging the Piece of Potatoes at the Barn a
great many of them rotting Made a heap
outside Randolph growing in the Marsh 27th
Randolph and I crossed to Hamletton
Brought a Drake to Tom Bought of
Mr Wood Linimas Boots 1.25 3 spools Thread for
Spence July 30 Bought of Summers Tobacco 25
Pair of Barges 35 Matches Seen Bismarck and
Mrs Chisholm at Summerton gave him 25 cents got
some apples at Hamletton got Gordon hat
28th Got Ready to crop got a crop with Henry
and Mr Burdo took 4th at autumn
Walked to Lancaster Stopt a Henry
Lavellette all night 25th St Michael
Day got on Board of the Bohemian
for Montreal 25 cents in Montreal at
about half past 11 - slept on Board of the
30th Left Montreal Went to Duns Office seen
David Fraser Met with Robert Mack Stated
for home on the Bohemian Bought 2 Bowls
and 2 Handkerchiefs Seen George Boseli
Seen Murdoch McDonald on the Point on
the Boat 1st of October in Lancaster up with
the Fisherman Stopt at Bosells Raining
Much Fine cut some Tobacco 2nd Gordon Randolph
and Murdoch McDonalds got some
some Stopt apples 3rd Mr Ward Mrs Ward Mrs Williams
and son here Selling us of Hunters son being
lost as he left home yesterday Taking up Potatoes
Cut all the Tobacco I rose up the

Mowing in the Marsh 7th rose hard to night
5th Ice this morning took in the stove
High Wind Drove some wood Burdo and
Henry the 4th fishermen went to Lancaster to
meet the Boat hard frost last night
6th Mowing in the upper end of the Marsh
19th cocks in the stack yesterday cut 19
of Blue Point to day went around the
Island to day Hernandez and I got a
lot of sweet Nicotia Water very low
falling every day Black Cherries falling
7th finished the stack 82 cock in it 25th Tom
in it 8th Raining Windy Drove some wood
took some Butter into home on the Burn Ruffer
had to leave her Barges 2 of them the Wind
is high 9th Fine Windy Water low Beech nuts
Plenty grapes Plenty 10th 10th 11th 12th 13th 14th 15th 16th 17th 18th 19th 20th 21th 22th 23th 24th 25th 26th 27th 28th 29th 30th
Birth Day 1844 put 15 cocks of Blue Point in the Burn
Drove some wood Made 15 cocks in the stack
put the Tobacco in the stable gathered a Basket
of grapes some fruit of Snow fell today
first snow that came Fine 11th a Fine Day
got Ready to crop but did not go on account
of Randolph cropped Bought of
Summers 1 lb Tea 50 Flour 50 11th 1881
Matches Randolph peeling Potatoes at Hamletton
got apples took up some of our Potatoes today
Leander Fernandez and the 11 Bushels of
hoard last night Aberills Steamer went
off this evening Mrs Burdo on her
12th got Potatoes 13th at Potatoes haying
14th at Potatoes 15th Raining Charles Rose and Holesworth
here I went up with them Went up to
Holesworths to see how I have sold the Coats
for 34 Dollars 8 Dollars for the stove to
take 4 Bushels of Wheat at 1.25 1.25 1.25
1 pint of the Vines Andrew Ross party
Captain Rankin children not well
