Tuesday 27th. We left Jay for Sanford by the steamer City of Jay, which goes up the River St John. I was very sorry to leave our good boarding house, we made up for a weeks starvation at supper time.

Wednesday Dec 28th. There is quite a change in the weather this morning was a lot warmer. The tropical scenery is grand along this river. It is terrible crooked so crooked that it is 107 miles by train and 211 by Boat - some times when the boat turned sharp corners the hind end would brush the bushes on shore. Some places the river was covered with what they call Water Hyacinths, but there was none in flower yet. Saw lots of cows they waded and swam all around eating the water Hyacinths. We arrived at Sanford about 9 o'clock this morning. We put up at the Bay Lo. Hotel. Harry, Louis and I went for a walk. this is the best place we have seen for garden stuff. also here we saw the first oranges although there is not many here -
