Tuesday + snow

Snowing and stormy especially in P.M. dense snowflurries not very frosty. Frank Dodge went to Louis Armstrongs in A.M. to see get place. We hauled back two loads manure from cattle stable in A.M. in P.M. Frank and I went to Wilsons then up to Gus Swens sale Frank went on home to Goodsville. I got down with D.P. sent.

Wednesday

Stormy and snowing again. not very frosty. We hauled back two loads manure in A.M. one from pig pen. In P.M. we drove with Jennie in cutter to Dixie Sullivans to see his horses then to Tom Broadfoots sale.

22

Thursday

One of the stormiest days this winter dense snow flurries with intervals of blue sky and sunshine. Cold day. I took 931 lbs pig chop to Wilsons Mill brought up load manure from Steels then Willie went down for chop again 41cts. In P.M. we went to Pankers sale bought neckyoke 75cts pd Girts down town got at Steels 100 lbs sugar 4.35 Groceries 40 3 doz eggs 42 stamps 4cts Butter money received lately 321. Sleazing again
