

Mr James Cameron Island 29 Dec 1888  
W Wind soft Killed the big Pig  
No Lights up to night no Boots  
to Day 3<sup>rd</sup> E Wind freezing cut the  
Pork and salted it Weighed  
320 Good Weight I went  
to the Head of the Island seen  
the Weasel Tracks Lewis the  
Indian here sent the Pot and  
Knife 2 Trace chains Brought  
my axe handle Sheep put in  
for the first time freezing  
hard to night 4<sup>th</sup> E Wind cold  
frosty 5<sup>th</sup> E Wind soft cold  
Patterson Mr Humm's Boy  
here for Butter and oil  
35 cents Broke on a Marsh-  
hay stack cutting up  
some of the Meat in the  
Milkhouse set a trap for  
the Weasel 6<sup>th</sup> a fine Day  
I think Mr Humm went off  
throwing seen a Boat coming  
to Charles Island St Nicholas  
Day Festival of the Germans  
Allen buried on the 6<sup>th</sup> 1887

Mr James Cameron Island 7<sup>th</sup> Dec 1888  
we West Wind Thawing Leander  
crossed to Hamiltons for the Mail  
took a Pair of nuts to Gordon  
and a vest 8<sup>th</sup> E Wind Leander  
and Livinia went to Charles Island  
John H. not well 9<sup>th</sup> Livinia  
using the frame Leander found  
Decoy fixing the Hides in the  
Barn a fine Day Digging for the  
Lake in a pile of snow some  
shooting salted the cattle  
10<sup>th</sup> Leander's Birth Day 1872  
fine Day Leander went to Sumnerston  
Bought of J Summers 100 of Flour  
2.50 a pair of Boots for Hugham  
1 Dollar 1/4 lb of Pepper 10 gave  
Leander 25 cents for his Birth Day  
Mr Humm's at Ducketts  
Leander met him crossing to  
the south side sawed a dead  
tree of oak in the grove that  
the Wind Broke the Top of it  
off the 15<sup>th</sup> of April 1865 a Big Gale  
of Wind the same Lincoln was  
shot I was Drove to Ross's  
Island wind rising high to  
night from the East high to  
White washing to Day
