Wind fine Rain some John H.
and Leander firing killed a big owl

West Wind a large white Gardner
before the door in the bushes
but the flies well went to the
South side & crushed the
handle in the shovel letting
the water run in places the
water high cattle picking out
But dont save feed 3rd
Mony Birth Day Windy 4th
Went to Hamiton Brought 3
pounds got 4 Bushels of oats and
2 Bushels Before fine & Wind Boat
calls Bad John H and Stanley killed
the young Bull 5th Sunday Windy
the 4th some manccles on the sleds
Lewis and Martin here took home our
pot gave him Tobacco coal oil cakes
got a basket
