 Frid 16 Another fine day looks like Autumn Paid Jimmie \$4.00 for the ground rent we used to pay Tom Heenan, I think I will now have to pay it to D. Robertson who has bought the Heenan property  
 Sat 17 Milk 50, coal oil 25, bread 21 96  
 Sun 18 Gen fund 25 Mrs Peter McEwan Glen Brook, called after preaching she looks well  
 Mon 19 We are having fine weather lately. Murdy went to Cornwall in forenoon Jimmie went in afternoon

Tues 20 Very fine day Ann is here cleaning the oil cloth. I am going to varnish the floors of hall and dining rooms Ann 50<sup>th</sup> bread 21 71  
 Wed 21 I went over the oil cloth in Hall. had to scrub it with slick soap and sand  
 Thurs 22 Jimmie was at a social at Lancaster Township saw Annie B. McLennan she is coming here to go to Cornwall with Jimmie and I.  
 Frid 23 10 P.M. Got back from Cornwall Jim went for Annie at 9.2 A.M. We left at 10.2 A.M. Went by front road. Annie went to Flannegans, we went to Farquhar's. We came home by Lancaster, left Annie at her home  
 Sat 24 Milk 50 bread 21.  
 Sun 25 Memorial service for Luningstone Dunlop, who was drowned when the Hospital ship was torpedoed on his way from Halifax there were 12 nurses on the ship, William Robertson line Road and Rodrick McLennan, Alex Roy's son, called, remained to tea  
 Mon 26 Ann 80<sup>th</sup> Very fine harvest-weather Coal oil 1 05  
 Tues 27 Another fine day  
 Wed 28 1 gall coal oil 25  
 Thurs 29 War looking bright for our side, slight showers. bread 21 Jimmie to Cornwall got me a flesh brush 15  
 Frid 30 Sent to Cutros for Oleomargarin \$5. 5 00  
 Sat 31 Milk 50, bread 21. Rain, some heavy showers Not many in church
