 Sunday Mrs Burdo & Peggy Bosell and Burdo  
 here Got Butter 23<sup>rd</sup> Putting in hay  
 24<sup>th</sup> Warm Mr Scroyer came yesterday Let  
 out the Calves from their Pasture  
 25<sup>th</sup> Mowing in the upper field  
 26<sup>th</sup> Mowing Gathering 27<sup>th</sup> Husking  
 Corn 28<sup>th</sup> at Corn Husking Corn Mowing  
 29<sup>th</sup> Emmanuel Morris here came last night  
 Mrs Burdo Peggy and Mr Burdo here 30<sup>th</sup>  
 Mowing 31<sup>st</sup> at hay 1<sup>st</sup> September Mowing  
 2<sup>nd</sup> putting in hay 3<sup>rd</sup> Mr Birth Day Mr  
 Randolph and to fish at Chrutes 4<sup>th</sup> Mowing  
 Wood 5<sup>th</sup> John Angus Birth Day 1850  
 6<sup>th</sup> Mowing in the Back Marsh 7<sup>th</sup> Put in some  
 8<sup>th</sup> Mowing Back Marsh 9<sup>th</sup> putting in hay 10<sup>th</sup>  
 Mr Gene here I went to Hamiltons at  
 their thrashing stopt to help them  
 Randolph came home had Mr Scroyer  
 Boat 11<sup>th</sup> at Hamiltons Gordon came  
 down with me stopt all night 12<sup>th</sup>  
 Gordon and his mother went to  
 Duke Bowers and the Baby a  
 very warm day I cropped with  
 Gordon to Mr Hamiltons 13<sup>th</sup> at home  
 I finished the Thrashing 14<sup>th</sup> came home  
 Gordon put me to the head of the Island  
 the Loan of the scythe Tom Ploughing  
 Fall Wheat Spreading manure yest  
 and commenced Ploughing 15<sup>th</sup> Mowing  
 15<sup>th</sup> Day cleared to Day to Miss Gard  
 Land field Mr Donald of Lancaster for  
 Windy 16<sup>th</sup> Mowing and Gathering 17<sup>th</sup> put  
 in 104 Cocks of Marsh Hay 18<sup>th</sup> Randolph  
 cropped Bought salt Bread peep hatch  
 Drawing Wool put in 36 Cocks Bismar  
 and 15<sup>th</sup> Sunday

Mr James Cameron Island Sept 20<sup>th</sup>  
 Digging Potatoes at the Barn shelling corn  
 21<sup>st</sup> Cut the Tobacco cut some on the last of  
 the corn stalks put them in 22<sup>nd</sup> Took in  
 the stove at the Potatoes 23<sup>rd</sup> Put in some  
 hay on the corn stalks 24<sup>th</sup> Went to Lancaster  
 with the Wool paid it 1.35 cents came  
 nine Indians on Suice Island had about 50  
 Rats caught in 2 nights stopt on the square  
 Island as the Wind is pretty high 25<sup>th</sup>  
 Randolph cropped to Sumner town  
 Bought 2 yds of Calico 28 cents Bread 28 cents  
 Peaches 1 yd Apples at Hamiltons  
 The old man Mr Derushie son here  
 from Chicago for to take the old man  
 up with him offered all his  
 fishing Krogging to me for 30 Dollars  
 the Princeps Course at Picnic on  
 De Kinsons Island to Day the Great  
 Exhibition in Montreal those days  
 26<sup>th</sup> Sunday Hamilton Mrs Hamilton and  
 Gordon here a Fine Day the old man and son  
 here gave his Ran and Broom to Sumner  
 27<sup>th</sup> Mr Derushie went off Windy taking up  
 Rubbish from the Tent put out some  
 Manure from Back of the Barn  
 where we are <sup>raining shelling</sup> going to build the  
 Stack 28<sup>th</sup> Mowing at the upper end of  
 the Marsh 29<sup>th</sup> St Michael or Michaelmas  
 Day very Windy Rain Fine Drawing Wood  
 shelling some of the loose corn and nebbins 30<sup>th</sup>  
 Drawing Firewood 129 an to pile 1<sup>st</sup> of October  
 Windy cutting the last of the Marsh hay  
 Puling wood at the Doer shelling corn at  
 night peeling apples
