- 8 Very fine day. Boys drew some straw and hay from village farm, 7 1/2 gall coal oil 18c
- 9 An eclipse of the moon at 1.2 am. I could not see the moon from our bedroom window. There was a little snow today. Still luggies on the roads, as well as runners. The boys drew two loads of hay
- 10 Cold and kind of stormy. Murdy went to Alexandria. The senior hockey team of Cornwall was expected today, but did not come
- 11 Fine bright day, not many in church. Mrs Given is home for a while

- 12 Monday. Fine mild day, Ann Hall 1/2 day 25  
 My drew all the hay
- 13 Fine day
- 14 Another fine day, the roads are pretty good. Jimmie drew two loads of green wood, Alick Laroque & Louis Courcier are cutting, 2 put in length 50c pr cord, a pretty good beam out on the rink last night. Pan bread 20
- 15 Fine bright day, Jimmie by 1/2 lb tea 25
- 16 Lovely day
- 17 Very fine day, Alice Rowlett, U.S. President's daughter married to Senator Longworth. 7/50 flour 1.45. pan bread 20, wooled wheat 25 2 10
- 18 Fine day, not many in church
- 19 Still fine Jimmie putting out manure
- 20 Dull, Murdy went to 7th of Kingston, sold 5 day eggs, 70 pr lb 13c tea 20, 1/2 lb tin 25, cream tartar 10. two menthol plasters 40c. Barber came on Monday
- 21 Pagan to rain last evening and was thawing all day. Murdy got home about 10. P. M yesterday
- 22 Charming day, looks like April weather, roads almost bare
- 23 Ditto Pa bot a four lb chaddock 20c
- 24 Double do. The roads are not fit for traffic
- 25 Dull, looks like rain no preacher, Mr Elder gave a short address
- 26 Cold, some snow fell, Ann Hall 1/2 day, Murdy coal oil 20 25  
 John Kennedy called to see if I had any thing to send to Marion. he is going to Syracuse tomorrow to see Clara
- 27 Fine and bright, cold N. wind. 6th Anniversary of the surrender of Orange at Red Bank
- 28 Ash Wednesday, Very cold, Alick Mc Hinnell paid 2.50 for rent. This has been a fine month just like April weather
