- 1 Sunday. Far came home last night. and Jim remained in Cornwall, Mr Burnet preached
- 2 Jim got home in morning and had news that peace was proclaimed in South Africa. The terms were signed on Saturday 10. P. M. Our village celebrated, ringing the church bells firing the cannon. Gave all the school a holiday, had speeches, and singing in St Andrews Hall, and fire works and bonfire at night. Rain. more chickens
- 3. Planted some corn. Got from Mrs Kamey baked. To cakes 10^{cts}, 1 loaf 5^{cts}. Heavy rain in afternoon. Dried
- 4. Rained heavily last night. and showers all day.
- 5 Fine day planted corn finished the garden sowed cucumbers, planted celery. Made a few calls. Was a while at the manse
- 6 Another fine day. Called at Dr Falkners at the Browns, and at Burgess & McCrummies
- 7. Mrs Givon and children left for Launceston last night. It rained mostly all day. Cornwall H School boys was down to play our H.S. boys. our boys made more marks. To pork & sausage 65^{cts}
- 8 Drizzled all night - now 10.40 raining steadily. Bella came yesterday.
- 9. To 1 lb tea 30. 100 flour 2
- 10 Rained in oven. Rain. Got a 25 gall. milk can from Reymon
- 11 Fine day. To 5 lb sugar 25. 4 yds cotton 7. 28. soap 10. To sausage 30. Washed 5 blankets & flannel shirts. began to rain about 6. P. M. Jim in Cornwall. Some day this week got. hanged clover & turnips for man on 2d Con
- 12 Dull day. I went to W. & M. S. at John Dingwall's. not many present. Mrs Dingwall was sick in bed

- 12 we done very little work. Mrs off 25. Called to see Daisy and at Browns. Gave Lizzie the black kitten. The cat is a great mooer
- 13. Rain
- 14. To 3 lb steak 26^{cts} Mary M. Dr. here bid went for her
- 15 Fine day threatening rain. Pirdie drove Mary to her school. Very hot
- 16 Hot today. Jim in rounds. Murchy ^{52. 1 lb 5} 44 coal 78
- 17. Rain yesterday, turned cold, like frost
- 18 Still on rounds. J. L's wife left for Launceston. The Shields family left for Wincor. The paper went visiting a party from west. The home cow went on the 13th. To 2 lb sugar brown 10. 1 spool silk 5. I am trying to make myself a cape of satin brocade
- 19 Fine day. To salt 10^{cts}
- 20. Mrs Kennedy 12. 25^{cts}. To sugar 25. soap 10. Coal oil 20. 80. Murchy bought a new buggy from Brady. 75. Bella & Christina to tea. 1 lb tea 30. Murchy
- 21 Fine day. Put out cabbage. Got from Sullivan
- 22. Rev Matheson (Fruit) preached in afternoon
- 23. Had a heavy shower. Murchy at 3rd Launceston
- 24 A shower today. Murchy to St Andrews. Put 42 lb butter at Willis 80^{cts}. A hen came out with 8 chickens yesterday. Jim is ploughing for buck wheat. Gave 1/2 bush buck wheat to Major
- 25 News of the illness of King Edward, and the coronation will get postponed. Jim is sowing buckwheat. Put up the flag pole
- 26. Heavy rain in morning, showery all day. no rejoicing on account of Kings illness. He was operated on for something like ependecitis (on Tuesday at 2. P. M.
- 27 Dull & drizzling all day. Murchy went to Maz-turton to work. Jim was clerk of the Council. G. H. not well.
