

The Trees began to look red

1 Sowed 3 1/4 bushel of Scotch wheat 2 ridges was plowed this Spring the rest was plowed last fall  
2 Sowed nearly 2 bushel of black see next the Scotch one ridge of it was plowed this Spring  
Scraped a patch across the place & am going but the orchard  
3 drew dung for the orchard in the afternoon

the Rev. Mr. Cullough preached in our school house he is belonging to Free Church

4 drew dung for the orchard it nearly all the dung we made last winter dull day with North E wind

5 began the plow for the orchard & spread dung for it very high wind North East

6 Sowed 4 1/2 bushel of John Youngs peas & 1 1/2 of the Gardner pea & better than a bushel of Rye on the place where we sowed rye last fall ground dry

7 Sowed 1 1/2 bushel of black see on the summer fall it was plowed last fall the plowed when peas was I began to plant Apple trees  
planted some geodes early

8 Sowed 1 1/2 bushel of black see when peas was last year went & heard the Bishop of Ontario Confirmed a number of young people at the Church

9 planted Apple trees Ben Younger helped the ground very dry Wm Ferguson sent for his horses woods begin to look green

10 the Rev Mr Carroll preached at the church

11 fine rain this morning sowed snagsseed on when it was plowed last fall at when I sowed wheat I went to canton to look for a horse Doll is not fit to work yet

I helped B. Younger to plant some Apple trees in the afternoon

12 rained most of the day fixed stakes

13 I came home this morning he was at Younger's after night he got no horse kept with Bill & Bell little rain
