7	<p>Wednesday</p> <p>Fine in a.m. clouded over in P.M. thunder lightning and rain about 5 o'clock. We took in rest of Black oats 2 loads and rest of No. 2 4 loads finished just before the rain. Willie paid Dr. J. M. Lean in full 40cts Mary down in P.M. got brass 5cts she brought up aunt Mary. We went up to see the cattle at night with Scott.</p>		40 5

Willie harrowed full wheat land twice and I stoked up rest of S. field We got chop 9 bgs 45 at Curless took down 66 5 lbs oats @ 33 bushel and 136 lbs wheat to Armstrong on aft and got on aft bushel plums <sup>5</sup>65 tomatoes <sup>3</sup>5 and paid for following Graham flour <sup>1</sup>0 oatmeal <sup>10</sup> soap <sup>5</sup> vinegar <sup>10</sup> meat at Mills <sup>2</sup>5 rubbers and corks <sup>10</sup>.
