

Saturday, May 2

1920

- Oct 21<sup>st</sup> Finished digging potatoes about 13 acres about 100 bu.
- " 24<sup>th</sup> Tom & Sean with the three little folks came down for the day, Mr & Mrs Rich bringing them in their car
- " 27<sup>th</sup> Some very fine weather for a week or two, which I used as much as possible to get the apples picked
- " 28<sup>th</sup> Took about 10 bu of Apples to Paris Station to get made into Cider (about 35 gal.) a very strong wind last night
- " 29<sup>th</sup> Finished plowing out stubble for corn.
- " Started to fall mangle in back road field
- " 30<sup>th</sup> Don Jack, Marquette & Louis came up to gather nuts etc
- Nov 1<sup>st</sup> A wet stormy day after a very fine October.
- " 2<sup>nd</sup> Went to St George in the afternoon, and went with J. Mc Keilly to the induction of our new Minister Rev. A. L. Patterson at the Church in Brambleton.
- " 3<sup>rd</sup> Started to top and grub the turnips.
- " 6<sup>th</sup> Mr & Mrs Wm Salisbury of Hamilton brought Mr & Mrs up to stay for a few days to fix the Grandfather Clock
- " 9<sup>th</sup> Finished drawing in the turnips 24 double box loads. Helped Hendersons to thresh.
- " 10<sup>th</sup> Started to plow corn stubble in back ten acre field
- " 11<sup>th</sup> Helped Ryecrafts to thresh.
- " 12 & 13 Stormy days with snow
- " 14<sup>th</sup> Gordon Grierson and family brought Aunt Maggie Galbraith up for a visit <sup>15<sup>th</sup> 16<sup>th</sup></sup> Helped Watson McPherson to thresh.
- " 16<sup>th</sup> Went to Angus Cornwells funeral at Langford, his death
