I got from the Experimental Station this fall seed of winter Cumber and Winter Barley. I worked up nicely but will need harrowing and rolling to smash the lumps. The roller is out of commission and I was going to take the harrows out this afternoon but could find no doubletires except the ones on the way in and I didn't have a choice that would fit them so I finished disking it crosswise and left it. Frank worked all day for Ben and got fifteen dollars from him to night Ben paid him two dollars a day. Cuth and the baby went down town this afternoon. Julia walked home before dinner. Hossie Shand was in this morning and invited Dad and Cuth to go with her in her car to visit Maunie to morrow. - Wamish

Sunday September 10th

The Shands came in the car this morning for Dad. Cuth & I intended to get to St. John's church, then they had dinner and spent the afternoon at the Bakers and got back here to tea. Frank and I went down to church and Frank rode home on his wheel to do the noon chores and then came back to Aunt's for dinner. Frank wasn't at church but got down to church dinner. Norton Brown the piano-tuner took the services both morning and evening. This afternoon I went over to the Herring's to inquire after Louie as Lewis Woodson told me this morning that she had been in bed with her hay fever. She was up this afternoon, however, and I was there all the afternoon. Ada came over and we all three walked down town. Louie gave me a pressing invitation to stay to tea but as I didn't know that Dad. would be home I told her I had to come back to do chores but promised to be back after tea. I did go over but was rather late as I met May & Glad having come out of church and walked down to the pier with them. When I got to the Herring's Lewis & Louie had gone home with Ada but they came back before I left and I was there for about an hour. Mrs. Woodson invited me in on my way home to have a piece of cake and I was there for another half hour. Ruby and Junit went to the Point yesterday with the Sloop and were to have been back this afternoon. Cool and Cragg
