- 14 Gull. Murdy went to Bridge End
- 15 Very fine day, Marion made the washing. To butter 35. Murdy went to North Branch
- 16 Very fine day. To butter 35. I was cleaning work house in forenoon, and went to the sewing meeting for bazaar in afternoon. Sold 4 doz eggs 20^{cts} per doz, got 14 lb flour. Put 1/2 lb tea 17. 1/4 lb black yarn 15
- 17 Very fine day. D. Mac Master sent a flag to the Public School last week, he came today to present it to the school. They had a grand time. Murdy got home at 6.30 P.M. I was working among the rags To butter ^{owe Jimmie} 47
- 18 To 3 loaves 15 I called at D. Falkners last night spent a very pleasant evening. Met Miss Paterson washed 8 blankets, and a barrel of rags 15
- 19 Cold day, high wind, killed two cockles To 4 loaves 20, 1 lb codfish 8, 2 1/2 lb butter 40 Far came about 5 P.M. Mrs Ellis 1.50 98
- 20 There was a slight fall of snow last night it melted off the ground, but was on boards this morning. My off in church 25 25
- 21 Cold west wind, hard frost last night - Sold 44 lbs rags to an Assyrian pedlar got 49 cts Jimmie left for Cobolt - Marion drove him to Martintown where he will take the mail coach to Cape Hill, To 2 loaves 10 10
- 22 Marion and I went to see birds. drove George met a big bull with a ring in his nose, and a chunk of a chain about 8 links. he began to bellow, we saw him again when we were coming home. he was off the road with cows
- 23 Put out the washing. Marion went to Lancaster with Dairy. Murdy went to Roxborough. To 3 loaves 15

- 24 Fine sunshine day, Dont brought 54 bush of oats he brought 56 yesterday. Meeting in Vestry 10
- 25 Fine day. To 4 lbs butter from factory
- 26 Fine day, killed two roosters, To 4 loaves 20 20
- Murdy came last night. Far came at 5.30 P.M.
- 27 Rain all day and a flurry of snow. Sent 15th for Offe 15
- 28 Far left in morning. Murdy to N. Lancaster, Mrs Robertson sent for me to meet Mrs Rod & Mrs Alex MacLennan, they left before I got down, I remain until 9 P.M. Murdy met Willie Gordon who paid him five dollars on an old account he owed Papa Fine and bright, To lard 30, bread 20 50
- 29 Fine cold hard frost last night, To bacon 30 30
- 30 Mrs Pigeon paid \$3.00 yesterday. To 1 lb. B. tea 35 35
- 1 lb S. tea 35, 4 yds edging 3 yds insertion 1 pair boot laces 40, wheatine 25 Farguhar & Mac Lennan and his men were here to Deymer they were digging a grave to reinter their dead who were buried at the old home three of them 27 years ago, one, the father later an idiot day. just the real indian summer 65
- 31 It is our Thanksgiving day, not many in church I counted all that I could see and that was 60, the farmers were likely ploughing, for fine days are few, the offering in church was the Cornwall G. Hospital, My Off 1⁰⁰ 1.00
- Farguhar and I went in afternoon to see Mary George, we found her well and smart - we spent a very pleasant day, got home at 6.30. Jimmie got home at noon, from his trip to Cobolt, Murdy got home about 2 P.M. Marion went to Macintosh's in evening. they came for her
- Mintroy paid his rent 1.50. to the 15th October
