 cutting stone wood Lots of EEL-  
 fishers on the ice 10<sup>th</sup> W Wind  
 Leander went for mail Bought  
 of a Mr Donald 3 lb Tea 1<sup>st</sup> Salt Peter  
 5 cents got a Lot of sweets

 got a letter <sup>from Donald</sup> from Williamstown  
 from Mrs Burton letting  
 me know that Ther Mother  
 was on her last went across  
 to Hamiltons Tom Jack  
 drove me out to Williamstown  
 she is very low E Wind turned  
 stormy to night Garry spunk  
 came down with the letter  
 Lewis 2 Boys here 12<sup>th</sup> at 6  
 O Clock this morning she  
 departed this life at the age  
 77 years 7 months and 3 Days  
 Born in 1813 on the 9<sup>th</sup> of June  
 in Williamstown Cold stormy 13<sup>th</sup>  
 Buried in the St Andrews Kirk  
 yard a clear frosty Day  
 14<sup>th</sup> Cold in Williamstown  
 Gordon came home on the 13) 15<sup>th</sup>  
 in Williamstown cold in  
 Williamstown Blsmarch  
 came home 16<sup>th</sup> in Williamstown  
 cold 17<sup>th</sup> came home from  
 Williamstown James Hugh Drove  
 me as far as Barretts no track  
 snow Deep
