Surgical Intervention in Chronic Gastric Ulcer.

The more definite indications for the surgical prevention of the complications of chronic ulcer depend upon three factors: (1) the presence or absence of pyloric obstruction, (2) the effect of a short course of medical care for not longer than four or five weeks, and (3) the age of the patient. A correct appreciation of these three points and their relations to each other will determine the advisability of surgical intervention in chronic ulcer.—Herrick; *Cleveland Med. Journ.*
