- 21 Fine day I am some better this morning I felt very unwell yesterday, 1 pan bread 24
- 22 Fine day, Jimmie got the 50 lbs sugar for Uncle Sandy, from John Bush and expressed it to Toronto
- 23 Sold most of beef to Sandy McIntyre for 7c if it is good & 6c if not good Cut up the fore gut and salted it in the cellar, 7c 4 lbs butter at factory, 7c 1 pan bread 24, rolled out 44 49
gugar 4c. John Mc Lennan, Tailor, here and brought us a big bottle of syrup
- 24 Fine day I was not out yet no one on today
- 25 Dull angry day sold 4 doz. 3 eggs at 13c do got 5 bars of sunlight soap, 25c due bill. 30 Jimmie is oiling the rest of the soap
- 26 Fine day
- 27 fine soft day Murdy to pan bread, Mrs J. L. B. in for a short time Pa paid Jimmie for cutting 7c
- 28 Rain all day. H. Pidgeon got key of game ground house, not the key for there is none but is going in, \$2.00 for month work and road work Mrs Gavin was in last night
- 29 Rain all day, 7c 1 pan bread, Murdy, Mrs Brown is having a party tonight
- 30 7c 1 lb tea 25, 1 lb extra 5 some small cakes Jimmie got wire nippers 30.
About the 19th there was a destructive fire in Toronto west of King Street, by the water property to the value of 15,000,000 destroyed
Hugh Pidgeon's wife would not go into little house, and got the lower flat of Kentville house, 3c for month

May 1904

- 1 Sunday Very fine bright day, I do not feel able to go out yet
- 2 Fine bright day, Ewin Mc Lennan & son took dinner with us, he is on his way to the North West Murdy went to St. Lawrence today Libby had a hair cuff in afternoon Mrs Santon 50c for something at her house
- 3 Very fine day sold 5 doz eggs, 13c 65c 7c from ~~13c 65c~~ 25
- 4 Fine day, Murdy cow doctor to see Libby, charge 2.00
- 5 Fine day, 7c bread 24 rolled out 44 68
- 6 English man, digging garden 7c 1 art top onions 25c for eggs
- 7 7c 2 pans bread 48, Marion came home this evening Jimmie got 20 bush oats of Mr. Laughlin 9c
- 8 J. L. and wife here to dinner, Murdy took Libby and Marion to see Bridie
- 9 Fine day, not doing much, home from hay
- 10 " Murdy took Marion down to 2nd Con Lancaster, planted some potatoes in garden, Mary McIntyre died Sunday night buried today, her trouble was heart failure, Jimmie is doing something at the farm, put our cows out
- 11 Put some seeds 2 papers onions 10, 1 of but 5c 15
1 pan bread 24, Carrots & sugar beets 20 44
- 12 Murdy sowed carrots onions beets
- 13 Jimmie is not getting on very well with seedling the team is almost useless.
- 14 Rented pasture to J. J. Mc Gregor 20 Con 7c 1/2 bush apples 25, bread 24, sold 7 doz eggs 44
98c sugar 25, 1 lb tea 25, 1/2 lb tea 20 - 1 lb sugar 8 98
The weather is quite dry.
- 15 Looks like rain, turned cold, Aunt Mary is poorly, I was not in church Katy a the wife
