 have had no heavy rains this spring so far.
 Willie drove down took 58 lbs wool to Smith
 left it there as Jim Russell was busy unloading bricks
 he got at Ellis' house 15 ds bolts for plow at
 Mennis 6 ds bread 20 ds 12 ds brought up 7 P.M.
 I fixed broken handles in wheel hoe.
 P.M. we spread 3 loads manure (sp) on
 pig yard below new orchard No H.A. and
 plowed most of it not sowed with grain
 Willie helped Mary plant cabbage in
 new orchard, also dropped some. They took
 old paper off wall in dining room. We sold
 9 1/2 doz eggs to Lewis @ 17 ds @ 1.61 got last weeks egg money 1 61
 1.62, 18 ds less than expected eggs being down 2 ds paid for coal 20 ds 1 62 20
 Willie drove 7 P.M. down in evening. Rogers and Go in to see with
 Mr. Lass in P.M. got dip for whiteflies. I fixed fence between us and
 Lindales. Girls got government cheque on Monday \$20.00. 20 00
