

Wednesday January 21st

Dad and Frank brought the wood out this morning just as we were about ready to start for town. top of the hill this morning, where he said Ray Hamann nearly tipped over a load of hay. Frank, Charlie Dixon and Fred Meener rode rails to hold it in the road from the top of the hill to the corner. Fred Meener told Frank that Jim Birdsell had been in to see me last night to ask about digging out the cut at Linsay's Hill but hadn't done it because I wasn't home so I let the boys out of the gate and drove on up to Shamus to telephone him. I couldn't get him but left word for Charlie to tell him to go at it in the morning as it was blowing too hard to-day. I also invited Charlie & Flossie down to hear the radio. Oliver & Frank were not long getting the stage set. They nailed a scumming on the sled and ran the aerial from it to the east gable of the house. They grounded to the pump and ran the wires through the key hole in the north door, they were then ready to pick up messages from any station that was broadcasting. They got a few from Buffalo in the afternoon but there wasn't much on till after six o'clock. I did the Chores up fairly early, and Ina, who was here all day and stayed for the concert, and I sat all through tea with the earphones on our heads, listening to music.
