- Sept. 17 drew in the oats from the Harper field in the forenoon heavy rain in the afternoon
- 18 heavy rain most of the day called our Boats
- 19 went to Brockville the Widow Ferguson went with me & got the Will of her Husband recorded I was it witness to it & made attle to it. took 3 barrels of Americans got 10 & 8 per barrel Gock finished cutting the wheat
- 20 cut the <sup>fall</sup> oats went to Malory town & made the returns of road work
- 21 Gock & the boys drew in 3 load of wheat & hauled the oats I went to Charlestown with <sup>32</sup> barrels to Biers & brought <sup>back</sup> 60 flour barrels
- 22 stacked the oats & wheat Grampa helped that finished the Harvest work
- 23 went to Carleton place & heard the Rev. W. Gwynne preach
- 24 went to Goyne with 60 flour barrels for Clenghane Gock & the boys drew rails & fenced the fall wheat
- 25 went to Brockville to an Agriculture Meeting
- 26 Gock began to plow the Thompson place for Rye
- 27 cleaned grain for the Show Gock finished
- 28 went to Mr. Moorehouse for seed Rye got 2 1/2 bushel & thrashed the Mulcahee had nearly 1 bushel Gock finished the plowing
- 29 Sowed the Mulcahee Rye on the first seven ridges East line the first ridge is twelve paces there a pile of stones at the end of the ridge the half of the eight ridge is sowed North the Mulcahee, sowed the 2 1/2 Bushel that I got from Moorehouse on the rest of the Gock went to Brockville with chickens got 4 1/2 each the Rev. Mr. Troop preached in Carleton
