Obituary From Glengarry News June 21, 1912

On McMaster's Island, on 8th of June 1912, James Cameron, a notable landmark of a passing generation, breathed his last at his home on that grand old island where the best years of his life were passed.

His funeral was a scene long to be remembered, crossing the angry waves of the blue St. Lawrence, in motor and other boats to where they met the hearse and the funeral procession awaiting them at Hamilton's Island, thence to the Summerstown church and cemetery. Rev. Mr. Matheson preached a very telling sermon in reference to the departed patriot.

The pall-bearers were Capt. Baker, Charles Ross, C.W.
Craig, J.S. Summers, Andrew Fraser and Thos. Jack. His coffin was draped with the Cameron tartan just as his sister's was
21 years ago. That same little cemetery at Summerstown is the last resting place on earth of many of his departed clansmen, or of the descendants of Lochiel that still live in our memory.

Among the relatives present from a distance were Mrs. W.M. Saucier, a grand niece of the deceased and Miss Saucier; James A. Burton of Maxville and Mrs. Burton, a niece; Mr. Alex Hall of Cornwall, and Mrs. Hall, also a niece of the deceased.

He leaves to mourn his loss his widow, six manly and devoted sons and four daughters.

We extend warmest sympathy to the bereaved.

Note by E.R.: When he died James Cameron was in his 88th year. He was born Oct. 25, 1824. Therefore when he began his diary on Jan. 1, 1855, he was 30 years old - 31 on Oct. 25, 1855.



Sunday the 24th of December, 1854 - Christmas Eve.

Angus McDonald McRory(?) on the 25th went to the Kit Kat Island-shot 4 muskrats, only got 1 - came home and went across with Angus McDonald and Granny - heard that Laplante got drowend (sic) and Phillip Lalonde's Boy. (Angus McDonald was married to Cameron's sister Mary; he was her second husband, being first married to Donald McMaster, father of Sir Donald. Both Donald McMasters were more familiarily known as Dan in their community and family).

On the 31st of Dec. Mr. Campbell and Ellen and Angus came across and Sandy came.

1st of January 1855- went to Baker's - I stopt (sic) at the Hog Island, for the first time I ever was on it. Thomas Munro and us went to see the crack (in the ice), little Duncan Munro came down with us.

On the 2nd-fanning wheat.

On the 6th-went to Duncan's about John's business - at Duncan's that night, Granny there - came home on <u>Sunday the 7th</u>; stopped at Nicholson's that night; that day at Mr. Campbell's the teacher in the Concession and was well received.

On the 8th-at home; bushing the roaad.

9th-chopping wood.

10-killed a weasel here and went to Christee's and killed another 11th-at home.

On Saturday the 13th-at night Archie McDonald frose(sic) fixing the crack in the ice; went to Salmon River. Ellen with the nags

JAN-

On the 16th and 17th-Ellen went home and Hugh Ann and I went across with her.

On the 19th-Mary went to see Archy McDonald. On the 20th-chopping white birch.

On Monday the 22nd of January-started for Bytown, went as far as Dover's that night.

23-From Dover's to Coburn's; one McDonell keeps there a very poor tavern; One man by the name of Mattice was going my road and we kept company; Stopped at Waggoner's, had 4 rounds; started and went to Harrington's; stopt (sic) there that night

<u>24th(January 1855)</u>-started for Sytown 26 miles from Harrington, passed Osgoode, stopped at Bailey's, stopped at Weigh's  $1\frac{1}{4}$  miles to Bytown, got into Bytown about 3 O'clock, stopped at Mr. Ritchie's, a Canadian in the Lower Town, a quiet decent tavern.

On the 25th-went to Nepean, passed this day three toll gates; stoppped at Mr. Donald Munroe's, Bell's Corners; took dinner and he used me well besides going with me to the man's house; seen Donald Bethune; came back to Bytown that night, stopped at Ritchie's tavern. The next day, the 26th wanted to see the Register and it kept me till 12 o'clock; seen the book and started (home); came to Weigh's; seen one of the Waddels; came to Bailey's and then to Harrington's, stopt (sic) all night; very stormy; next day 27th of January started, seen John Brown; only travelled 15 or 17 miles, came to Waggoner's. 29th Sunday-started from Waggoner's; stopped to take lunch, cakes and milk, graham stove on corner; stopt (sic) at Dover's; came to Rig Archie's, stopped at Nicholson's all night.

29th-got home; Granny Rose buried.

30 and 31st- chopping wood.

FEB-RUARY

Feb. 1st-cutting (wood probably) and thrasing (sic) wheat.

On the 6th-Mr. J. Campbell, teacher here; <u>Tue.</u>-fanning; <u>Thursday-</u>went off.

On the 10th-Mr. Peter Finney here, stopt (sic) all night.

Sunday the 11th-Amelia Laplante came.

Monday the 12 th-Charles, Hiram, Angus went to Peter Finney's; Poney came.

13-Mr. Campbell came.

14th-Angus the Tailor came.

<u>15th-I</u> and the tailor went to Salmon River, bought of Kimball and McPhee's  $2\frac{1}{2}$  yards of cloth 6?3, 1 gallon sirup (sic) 2/6, duty 4d, combs 10d, sugar 1/3.

16th Feb. (1855)-drawing wood, killed 3 muskrats.

Sunday 18th- went to Nicholson's.

19th-stopt (sic) \frac{1}{2} day then came home: LOTTERY NIGHT.

20th Tuesday-at Frances' drawing wood; Mr. Watts and wife here.

21st- Ash Wednesday, at Sermons.

22nd Thursday - Court Day; Charlie here.

24th-drawing straw.

On Sunday 25th-Bill and Martha Nicholson and Stanley here.

27th Tuesday-Rec. 1 dollar from Frances and drawing straw; grey mare gone to McInnis'.

28th-Drawing wood for Frances and went to John's on River; (continued)

1st of March-went to Nicholson's for the saw; St. David's Day,

Friday the 2nd of March-went to Nicholson's to chop; got the trial of their gun.

MARCH

Saturday the 3rd of March-Began to draw to the Bank (of the river) cordwood.

4th Sunday-the teacher, Mr. Campbell here and Ellen, and Flora McGregor went home with them; Charlie, Suse, Arrawetra (an Indian) here; caught a sea gull in my trap.

Monday the 5th-Peter's Bee; Sandy came at night.

Tuesday the 6th-Donald Cameron, Teacher of Dancing here; Christee came home on the 5th.

Wednesday the 7th-Thrashing (sic) and fanning.

8th-got a fox and James Nicholson here from Salmon River.

9th-Drawing wood.

10th Saturday-Big Bill here and John Hamilton; drawing to Hamilton's wharf; Bill here all night.

Sunday 11th-Grey (mare) came home.

Monday 12th-skinning a fox; wood to school.

Tuesday 13th-Granny and Amelia went to Angus' to St. Regis and Sandy to David Summer's Bee; came home in the morning of the 14th; very stormy; Rankin's wife, Archy McDonald and Lank got astray coming From Salmon River.

<u>Tuesday 15th</u>-John Nicholson here and Frances and wife, Christees; Went off to the Basswood tavern.

Friday 16th-went to Williamstown to get the Boy Christened, called him James Hugh (this was his sister Mary's youngest child by her marriage to John Angus McDonald); heard that old Mr.Alexander Ross departed of the King's Road, Dundas Street! Very fine old gentleman. (this was Alexander Ross who owned the farm on the west side of the Summerstown road, both north and south of the King's Road, a stone house. He died Feb. 1, 1855, aged 87 years. He was married

to Anne Munro who died 11th of April, 1846, aged 68 years. Both are buried in St. Andrew's cemetery, Williamstown.);
McInnis' son here for the mare.

17th St. Patrick's Day-Angus went to French Mills and Hugh Ann went to Nicholson's; Charlie here and McInnis' son came to see if Mary Ann was here.

he is subject to and give him a ride part of the way.

19th Monday-went home with Nicholson's gun.

20th-chopping maple on the Pitt Point.

21st-Bill and Richard Greer and Boy here; McInnis' boy here for Grey
(mare); a raphael (sic)(raffle written in line above) at Peter
Grant's of William Summers' (clothes, belongings?);

22nd-Angus went with Mr. McLean the Blacksmith to Salmon River for plank; Mr. McLaurin the Minister of Martintown church departed.

March Friday the 23rd, 1855-Allen McInnis here for the mare.

24th-Drawing wood to the Bank (of the river); Sandy went to Lancaster.

Sunday the 25th-Big Bill here and McInnis's Son came home with

the mare.

Monday 26th-Fanning the last of the wheat; Went to Little Island, South Side and Drawing to the Bank. (wood to river bank).

Tuesday 27th-Went to Nicholson's, stopt (sic) all Day and all night, Mr. McCracken and wife there; went to Salmon River for \$30 of goods; James McDougall married; Angus Rankin here; Went for Fat Pine; Chales Tupper here, the Eel spear; I came home on the morning of the 28th from Nicholson's; drawing wood to the Bank.

Thursday the 29th-Drawing wood to the Bank.

Friday the 30th-Dan and I went to Salmon River to mill with wheat; bought of W. Streeter 3 pence worth of sweetys(sic), 1 copper's worth of gum, 2 glasses (of whiskey) 2d paid and owe 2 pence; stopt (sic) at Hopkins, had 3 glasses of whiskey, paid; had dinner, William Hamilton there; came home, McLean here, Angus Suple here; George Greaves after plank; the carrier here. (mail?), Saturday the 31st of March-Splitting the Maple Tree on the Pitt

Saturday the 31st of March-Splitting the Maple Tree on the Pitt Point; Grey(mare)across to Baker's with Ashes; Mr. John Campbell, teacher came; Charlie and Son here shooting squirrels.

April 1st Sunday-Pat, William and John Hamilton and Charles Rose here; Mr. Campbell and Sandy went across.

Monday the 2nd of April-Drawing to the Bank (of the river)

3rd of April-Sandy went to Nicholson's for the beetle.(a beetle was a big wooden maul, a homemade sledge hammer used for driving wedges when splitting cordwood, or to drive fence posts); John Nicholson here; Angus went across.

4th-Hugh Ann to Nicholson's with Sandy and got a present.

5th- Mr.Peter Grant went to get married; Angus went to Lancaster;

Blackbirds came; Black ducks came; a flock of wild geese, 5 seen.

6th-Geod Friday-I went to Nicholson's

7th-Drawing to the Bank (wood to the river bank).

8th-Easter Sunday.

9th Monday-the last Papers came, Sandy crossed to Bank; horses got in. (they probably were turned out in the fall, except for those needed for work and driving); Margaret and David Summers horses got in.  $10^{-p}$  anning oats,  $18\frac{1}{2}$  Bushels; raining and snowing and Sandy making a paddle; the ice beginning to fail.

11-raining; Shot at a muskrat, didn't get him.

12th Thursday-Drawing to the Bank.

Friday 13th-Drawing to the Bank; killed a muskrat.

Saturday 14th-ice opening slowly; Drawing Wood; Seen a weasel and it was changing colour; Loons came.

## 15 Sunday-

16th-chopping and splitting Sandy's Wood; Seen (sic) pigeons.

17th-Fixing my canoe and went to the Little Island, killed 2 muskrats.

18th-crossed in a canoe to Baker's; Found 2 oars; Sandy making Paddles; Ellen came home.

19th-Angus went to Salmon River; I went to the Kit Kat (island); Raising stones and Ploughing; James Cameron, carpenter's son burnt (sic) out at Alexandria on the 18th of April.

Friday the 20th-I went to Christee's; killed a duck; Charlie here; 2 Indians came, stopped all night.

21st Saturday-Sandy went to Lancaster; Mr. Campbell here; Ellen went home; Suse here; Set 6 Traps; The Very Reverend Mr. John McKenzie Departed this life in the Morning of the 21st of April, 1855, Minister of the Presbyterian Church of Williamstown; he was beloved and is deservedly regretted by all who knew him; Peace to his remains. Sunday 22nd-went Down with Suse and Dan, Hiram, Hughann, John, Angus and Sandy came. (probably down to Williamstown to Rev. McKenzie's wake).

Monday 23rd St. George's Day-I went to Salmon River with my furs; 4 chaps got a Capsise (sic) out of my canoe; had 8 rounds (of whiskey) at Luke's; sold my furs to Mr. James Cameron, Squire's Son; Fec. Cash \$7\frac{1}{4}; sent a letter to John; Stopped at Luke's that night; came home on the morning of the 24th of April - Donald McGillis here for the punt (a small flat-bottomed boat); George Nicholson here; Granny

came.

25th-ploughing and gathering stones.

Thursday April 26th 1855-clearing the Lower Point; 2 muskrats got. Friday the 27th-Clearing in the Marsh; 1 Rat (muskrat).

28th Saturday-Steamer, New Era went Down (down the river); heard of Ranald Fraser's Death; got a rat.

#### Sunday 29th-

Monday 30th of April-went to pay W. Spink; paid him ₹0/23/9 for the cap; bought a pair of boots, paid them ₹0/13/9; Bought of Baker 2 yds. of tape, paid.

1st of May-Went to Salmon River; paid Luke; got \$100 from Luke for fur; bought of Kimbal 1 fratsin(?) of Onion Seed. 3 pence; Went to Hopkins for the yoke; George and Martha here for the cart; Took home the tools.

<u>2nd of May-</u> Granny went across to Lancaster; Steamer, St. Helen went Down (the river); John Gartshore (boat) went down (river) on the 1st of May.

3 of May-Jenny Lind (boat) went down (river); Nicholson's, James and George here for the cart.

4th Friday-planted potatoes and sowed barley; Sandy went across with the McInnis canoe.

5th-Charles Tupper with \$7 of fur, paid all in Full -  $1/10/\frac{1}{2}$  for all, clear now; went to Salmon River for a letter; \$1 from Hopkins for Fur; 19 took up for Luke Powin, sold to the Squire, Rec. in cash 11/3; Bought of Luke  $\frac{1}{4}(lb.?)$  of Tea, 1 lb. of sugar, 1 Box of matches, paid 1/3; paid Hopkins  $2\frac{1}{2}$  pence; 1 copper for Sweetys (sic) at Minkler's; 1 copper at Norman's; 6 glasses at the Boar Skin's 6 pence; came home at night; Mary Pankin and Granny came.

6th-at home.

Monday the 7th-Marg and Mary Rankin, Dan and John Angus went to Hamilton's, then went to Angus McDonald's; Frances came home.

8th Tuesday-Angus went to S(almon) River; Big Trees Kitten Point cording (Cording, to cut up into cordwood); Campbell, Weaver passed to Brunstane's to trim trees (cuttting up the branches for firewood).

May 8 1855-raising stone for the Garden Fence.

9th Wednesday-Angus came home; Christee's came and got the big canoe; old John McLaughlin Departed on the 8th.

Thursday the 19th-Court Day in Lancaster and I went to see Mr. Spink about the Bill that Angus got from him and gave me when I was going to Bytown; Gave Mr. Spink the leather.

11th Friday-Setting the line (a long fish line with many hooks),
Henerey Rosell and I, Christees there with the canoe.

<u>Saturday the 12th-</u> Went to Angus Cameron's up the Front about Hughann, Mary and Dan and I; making a sturgeon Penn (sic); Sandy went off.

Sunday the 13th-Thinking about Starting off.

Monday the 14th-Planting Corn and Harrowing.

15th Tueday- Nicholsons home with the cart I use here; got a sturgeon; Brittania (sic) a-ground; Lord Elgin, Propeller a-ground at Hamilton's Island.

16th-Hugh Craig here, stopped all night.

17th-Went to Montreal on the Steamer, Fashion From Lancaster, Deck Fare 3/9.

Sunday night the 20th-large fire in McGrath's buildings; stopped in Montreal till the Wednesday then came home on the British Empire to Cornwall; walked down on Thursday the 31st; Henery and George and Louis put me across; John Nicholson here all night.

Friday the 1st of June 1855-Making a cook house.

Saturday the 2nd of June-Fishing Sturgeon; 2 Christees here.

Sunday the 3rd-

Monday the 4th- Henery, Lewis and Peter here and Amelia; Clearing on the Lower Part of the Pitt Point, Hiram, Dan and I.

On the 5th 6th and 7th-Hamiltons here, William, Elizabeth and Lydia Ann; Horses went across.

8th-Mr. Campbell came; Frances here.

Saturday 9-Jack went to Baker.

Sunday-Mr. Campbell crossed to Lewises (sic).

Monday the 11th-Mr. James McDougall here for 6 plants; Angus went to Lancaster; Frances here from Charlie's; Raft Crew Playing Ball on the Pitt Point; clearing on the P.P.; Lent a line to the Raft Crew. 12th Tuesday-clearing; Angus came from Lancaster.

13th-Went to Hamilton's, Mary, Dan, Hiram; Sandy came for his Axe; clearing (land); commencing to hoe Potatoes.

Thursday the 14th-tried to go twice with the Elm Plank, Length 31F 6I (31 feet six inches) 13 inches broad, 4½ inches thick (quite a plank!)

15th May-Mary, Dan, Amelia, Hiram went to Fort Covington.

16th-Went to Baker's with Ashes; Neil came from S(almon) River.

Sunday the 17th of June- Mrs. Laplante here, George Boselle, George Nicholson; Neil crossed; 2 pikes (fish).

Monday 18th-went to Fort Covington, sold my iron(?); no letter, took Frances home and I went for the horses; Henery crossed with us; took the plank to Mr. W. Spink; took the pine from Roses.

20- went to the Gore for my pistol.

21st-piling the cordwood.

<u>22nd</u>-Cording (doing something with wood that ends up with it piled so it can be measured in cords 8'x4'x4'); Farquhar Bethune here; Jim at Nicholson's for canoe.

23rd-Cording; got 3 spears, s from Baker, 1 from Nicholson; Fishing at night; Bad with the Boils: Amelia went across.

Sunday the 24th-Raining.

Monday the 25th-Angus crossed; Amelia came with Bosells.

Tuesday- went to Lancaster to get the spear fixed.

Wednesday 27th-Malcolm Dingwall came here; Raising Stone Above the Barn.

28th-Granny came.

29th-hoaing(sic).

30th-Campbell here.

Sunday 1st of July-Campbell, Sandy and Granny crossed.

# TULY Monday 2nd-

July 3-

4th- American Independence Day.

5th July-Got John's bull.

6th-Granny came today; Dan here; Christee Lost a Maskinonge.

7th-Hiram and I went to S(almon) River, got a kettle.

Sunday the 8th of July 1855-Charles Tupper here.

Monday the 9th-Drawing Wood.

10th-took the Bull home; Drawing Wood, went home with the Scow; at Roses', got an oar.

11th-went as far as the head of Hamilton's Island; Mary and Dan took Granny Pack; took the flour from Baker's.

12th of July-Drawing Wood to the Gate; Fishing at night, lost a sturgeon by my spearing at him with the Eel Spear; Charlie and Suse here;

Charlie gave me a minno (sic) hook.

13th-Drawing to the Bank from the Gate.

14th-Drawing and Piling Wood; Bosells here with a Hat; Amelia crossed, going to hoe Joe's Potatoes; Mr. L. Campbell, the Weaver, Jim Nicholson, G. Boselle, Christee here on Sunday the 15th.

16th-Granny crossed; a Bargain about the Acre; Drawing Wood.

17th Tuesday-Seen the Oak (boat); Drawing Wood; heavy Lightning;
John Grant Gravilace (Gravilace was a nickname) on the King's Road,
Dundas Street Struck with Lightning, a heavy storm, took the pipe
of the Charlevoix (house).

<u>Wednesday the 18th-</u> Took home the Oak stick; Amelia went off home; Done Drawing.

19th-Lost my knife.

Friday the 20th-Ellen came home; Sandy came looking for the anchor; Charlie and Suse here.

<u>21st</u>-Sandy and I crossed to Baker's, paid him his charge; Looking for the anchor; bought a box of Capel  $3\frac{1}{2}d$ ,  $\frac{1}{2}d$  for Liquorice.

The 22nd of July 1855-went to look for the anchor; Frances not home; went to get the Grappling (a big hook on a pole) fixed.

Tuesday the 24th- Ellen and I went to Salmon River, bought gum, liquorice, candys (sic), Sugar, meal, rools (sic) of wool, Shatol, no Duty; Sent a letter to Allen; Luke for Berries; I stopt (sic) at Timber Joe's; Boselle got the Canoe; Looking for the anchor.

25th Wednesday-Grinding the Scythe; Commenced to mow; Bad with the Boils.

26th Thursday-Regan to mow the Lower Point; Began to Rain. Friday-Looking for the anchor; crossed to Baker's.

Sunday the 29th-the Dog at the Sheep, took the sheep from the Island.

Monday the 30th-cutting the Barley and hay.

31st of July- Gathering the Barley.

in the Barley; Charlie here going for a letter to Baker's, stopt (sic) here all night.

On Tuesday the 2nd of August-cutting and making cocks (coils of hay) on the Lower Point.

Friday the 3rd of August-gathering (hay); old Mr. Angus Cameron

Departed of Meadow Bay, a Very fine old Gentleman and a Consanguinity

of our Race.

Saturday the 4th- Charlie came, told us of the death of Mr. Cameron; Cutting on the Pitt Point; Angus crossed to the Wake.

Sunday the 5th- went to Charlie Tupper's, all the children.

Monday the 6th-Angus Cameron buried; Mr. Campbell came.

Tuesday the 7th-Raining all Day; Began the Swamp to cut (that is cutting hay in the swamp).

The 8th of August 1855-Went to Slamon River with Barley to mill, Mr. Campbell, Ellen and I; Paid Kenneth McRae 2 dollars which I owed him; 1 dollar's worth of tea; got a box of Water Proof Caps (for a gun); gave Luke  $7\frac{1}{2}d$ ; came home.

Thursday the 9th-Mowing in the swamp.

10th-Mr. Campbell crossed home; Done mowing in the swamp; commenced above the House at 12 o'clock.

Saturday the 11th-outting hay in the barn, 5 Loads of Hay; making coils in the swamp.

Sunday the 12th-The Raftmen came, 8 pilots of Calvin's Raft, the man, Mr. Larose here; Preaching in the Front, Mr. Green and Mr. McPherson.

Monday the 13th-Mowing hay in the Upper Field; putting in hay, began the Big Stack, 100 coils in it, finished it on Wednesday the 15th.

Mr. McDougall here on Tuesday the 14th-Mr. Calvin's son here for withs (sic) (they used withes, grapevines, cedar roots etc. to tie the logs and different parts of the timber rafts together). On Thursday the 16th Regan another (stack) and finished it before the rain, 30 coils; mowing oats; the Barge Mary came in the evening of the 15th for the Wood. (Note here by Cameron:I made a mistake by not putting the Dates of the month after one another).

Friday the 17th-William Lavelette here for the cow.

Saturday the 18th-Pegan the Pease (peas), all the Poatmen working at them, Finished them, went for a gallon of Whiskey for them, all of them on the Spree.

The 19th of August 1855-the Barge went off; all Boselles here with a Hat; Angus crossed about Suple with Bosell's 20# (probably the gauge of a shot gun); Got the Land; Putting in the 1st Cats.

Tuesday the 21st-Putting in the Pease, Finished them.

Wednesday the 22nd-Mowing Oats below the corn; Thomas Summers got his hand hurted (sic) by the Bursting of a Gun.

23rd-Mary and Clary Shapire and Baker Girl here.

24th Friday-Mowing; went to Boselle's, Dan, John Angus, Hiram and I.

Saturday the 25th-putting in oats; the Indian got the stick for paddle; Ottawa (boat) Late going down (river).

Sunday the 26th of August-

Monday the 27th-Granny crossed.

28th-Regan the Wheat Cutting; Charlie Tupper here; I went to Christee's. Wednesday the 29th-Binding Wheat (by hand of course).

30th-John McMaster and Charlie Hopkins here, Going to Lancaster; Angus

went; 2 paddles got from the Indians.

3rd-Granny came; Ellen crossed; heard of John Son's Death; Heard of Sandy the Sheriff being Drowned.

5th-Went to Lancaster for the Big Canoe; Paid A. McLennan 3/9 for Leather; Went to Grear's and Rankin's at the R(iver) Road Bridge. 6th-put out the Line (Fishing line); Sowed Pease.

<u>7th</u>-Granny crossed with Ellen, Hugh Ann and Hiram; Christee came home, got his Gun and Line.
