Sun 30 Sent 25 for General fund John and Agnes were here
 to dinner. Mr Govin sent in evening to see if we would
 like Prayer Meeting on our lawn I would like it but
 we had no seats 25

Mon 31 This morning papers said there were forest fires in
 New Ontario about 200,000 lives lost and a great
 deal of property as well as bush
 And in New York there was an explosion in a
 munition factory along the water front, the loss
 will run into millions. The German submarine
 is still at Baltimore 70 2 loaves 10 10

August 1st report They think there 500, lost in fire 3 47
 Jimmie went to Montreal for to get glasses. his
 were broken, he left them in his breast pocket
 and hung his coat on a fence. when a
 young horse chewed the coat pocket and
 broke the glasses. Alas poor Jimmie 15 19
 Total = 20-66

 Sunday night, Jimmie left for Cornwall for
 his car, G. P. M. came by train did not get

 train for ~~St. John's~~ ^{Robertson} 1 gall coal oil 18 18
 3 packages Corn flakes 25, bluing 5 30

Thurs 3 Threatening rain Ann Hall paid 3⁰⁰ rent
 I picked B. currants

Fri 4 70 2 lbs butter 70 - bread 12 80

Sat 5 Milk 42 bread 10

Sun 6 offing 25 Cousin Dens wife was here for
 " a while until he came out of church
 " Mr Govin is away for his holy days

Mon 7 Ann 30. 1 gall coal oil 18 2 loaves 12 80
 Murdy left to do some work with
 There was lightning in evening

Tues 8 Rain all day now 4 P. M. still hoary

Wed 9 Rain all last night and rain all
 this day 70 2 lbs butter 70, tin lice powder 1 05
 Jimmie went to Colonel Robertson to dinner

Thurs 10 D. McCremon gave a cheque on the Merchants
 Bank for 7.30 for hay got standing in home
 meadow. Jimmie cashed it

Fri 11 Jimmie motored to Cornwall. Began to rain at
 4. P. M.

Sat 12 Milk 42 coal oil 18 - 4 loaves 20, 3 Corn flakes 30. 1 10
 Jimmie went in afternoon to Brygas at St. Johns church
 Lancaster. He went again after night

Sun 13 Very fine day Sent 25 to church. He had new
 corn for supper, it is not very good yet 25

Mon 14 Lovely day. Jimmie is off with a long thin
 man who is looking at the growing crops
 D. and Mrs Gunn called last night
